



WOMEN RANK HIGH IN NFL OFFICES

More and more, women are playing a decision-making role in the NFL.

Co-owner of the Jacksonville Jaguars and Chair/CEO of the Jaguars Foundation **DELORES BARR WEAVER**, for instance, is a woman dedicated to making a difference in her adopted hometown of Jacksonville. Delores has a sincere interest in many areas of need. Through the Jaguars Foundation, she has supported the work of many local agencies. In addition to her concerns for Jacksonville's children, Delores has set a personal goal to help level the playing field of life for women and minorities.

"In the 10 years I have been involved in the NFL, I am certain more qualified women have been hired and/or promoted throughout the league," she says.

What does Weaver think women can bring to the table that perhaps men can't?

"We all know about women's intuition, that thing for which there is no degree," she says. "I am of the notion that intuition coupled with intelligence would bring a perspective to decision-making in the executive boardroom."

**AMY TRASK** started out as an intern for the Oakland Raiders in 1983 when she was in law school. Today, she is the team's CEO.

Trask did not set out to prove that a woman can run a sports franchise as well as a man, or to pave the way for a new generation of girls to follow in her footsteps. She just loved the game of football and worked hard, and that put her at the top of a male-dominated industry.

"Women in the NFL should be judged no differently than men in the NFL," says Trask. "People are people. I am very privileged. I work for an organization that has a five-decade tradition of hiring without regard to race, ethnicity, religion, age, gender, etc. I hope that some day all businesses will operate this way."

St. Louis Rams chairman and owner **GEORGIA FRONTIERE**'s commitment to the St. Louis community recently earned her St. Louis Variety's prestigious title of 2005 Woman of the Year.

"In any business, I feel that women have the ability to rise to the occasion," says Frontiere. "I believe that most successful women will accept suggestions from men and add their own insights, which can be helpful in any business dealing.

"I feel that when men and women are working together, one can supply what the other lacks, and that is part of the reason why men and women working together can be an unbeatable team."
