While women have comprised about 40 percent of the NFL fan base for years, the only NFL apparel for them consisted of small-sized T-shirts and polo shirts as recently as two years ago. Now there are official NFL camisoles, earrings, and handbags.

"Women fans have indicated through their purchases that they really appreciate fashion and apparel accessories that have been developed for them, whether it's a feminized logo, a pretty color, or a current cut or fit of a garment," says NFL Vice President of Consumer Products **SUSAN ROTHMAN**.

The NFL was the first professional league to develop a full line of women's apparel in 1997. Last year, sales of women's NFL-licensed merchandise tripled from the year before.
