Faulk has gained 2,000 combined yards four times in his career, tied for the most in NFL history. Faulk needs one more season with 2,000 combined yards to pass Eric Dickerson (4), Brian Mitchell (4) and Walter Payton (4) for the most all-time.

Faulk needs 13 rushing yards and 416 receiving yards to become the first player in NFL history with 12,000 rushing yards and 7,000 receiving yards. In 11 seasons, Faulk has 11,987 rushing yards and 6,584 receiving yards.

LA DAINIAN TOMLINSON, San Diego, has rushed for 200 yards in a game four times in his four-year career. Tomlinson needs one 200-yard rushing game to pass Jim Brown (4), Earl Campbell (4) and Barry Sanders (4) to move into sole possession of second place all-time and needs two to tie O.J. Simpson (6) for the NFL record.

EDGERRIN JAMES and **MARVIN HARRISON**, Indianapolis, have registered 100-yard rushing and receiving performances in the same game 19 times and need two such games to pass Emmitt Smith-Michael Irvin (20) for the most in NFL history.

JERRY RICE, Denver, needs three receiving touchdowns to become the first player in NFL history with 200 career touchdown receptions. In 20 seasons, Rice has 197 touchdown receptions, the most in NFL history.

Rice has 1,549 receptions in his 20-year career, the most in NFL history, and needs 51 to become the first player with 1,600 career receptions.

Rice needs 100 receptions to pass Marvin Harrison (4) to become the first player in NFL history with five 100-catch seasons (see Harrison note). In 20 seasons, Rice has four seasons with 100 receptions.

Rice needs 105 receiving yards to become the first player in NFL history with 23,000 receiving yards. Rice has gained an NFL-best 22,895 receiving yards in 20 seasons.

Rice has led the league in receiving yards six times in his 20-year career and can tie Don Hutson (7) for the most seasons leading the league in receiving yards.

Rice needs one 200-yard receiving game to tie Lance Alworth (5) for most career 200-yard receiving games. In 20 seasons, Rice has four 200-yard receiving games.

Rice needs 1,454 combined yards to become the first player in NFL history with 25,000 combined yards. In 20 seasons, Rice has gained an NFL-record 23,546 combined yards.

Rice needs 1,460 total yards from scrimmage to become the first player in NFL history to reach 25,000 scrimmage yards. In 20 seasons, Rice has gained an NFL-record 23,540 total yards from scrimmage.

MARVIN HARRISON, Indianapolis, needs 100 receptions to pass Jerry Rice (4) to become the first player in NFL history with five 100-catch seasons (see Rice note). In nine seasons, Harrison has four seasons with 100 receptions.

Harrison has 845 career receptions in his first nine seasons and already has more catches than any player in NFL history had in their first 10.

Harrison needs 96 receptions to pass Irving Fryar (851) and Art Monk (940) to move into fifth place all-time. In nine seasons, Harrison has 845 receptions.

Harrison has three 1,500-receiving yard seasons in his nine-year career and needs 1,500 receiving yards to tie Jerry Rice (4) for the most 1,500-receiving yard seasons.

Harrison has 47 100-yard receiving games in nine seasons and needs four to pass Michael Irvin (47) and Don Maynard (50) to move into second place all-time.

Harrison needs three touchdown receptions to pass Tim Brown (100) and Steve Largent (100) to move into third place all-time (see Owens note). In nine seasons, Harrison has 98 touchdown receptions.

TERRELL OWENS, Philadelphia, needs six touchdown receptions to pass Marvin Harrison (98), Tim Brown (100) and Steve Largent (100) to move into third place all-time (see Harrison note). In nine seasons, Owens has 95 touchdown receptions.

JIMMY SMITH, Jacksonville, needs 1,000 receiving yards to pass Cris Carter and Steve Largent (8) to move into a second place tie with Tim Brown in 1,000-yard receiving seasons. In 12 seasons, Smith has eight 1,000-yard seasons.

TONY GONZALEZ, Kansas City, needs nine touchdowns to pass Wesley Walls (54), Jerry Smith (60) and Shannon Sharpe (62) to become the all-time leader in touchdowns by a tight end in NFL history. In eight seasons, Gonzalez has 54 touchdown receptions.

DANTE HALL, Kansas City, has five kickoff-return touchdowns in his five-year career. Hall needs one kickoff-return touchdown to tie Mel Gray (6), Ollie Matson (6), Gale Sayers (6) and Travis Williams (6) for the most in NFL history.

Hall needs one kick return touchdown (kickoff or punt) to pass Mel Gray (9), Ollie Matson (9) and Deion Sanders (9) to move into sole possession of third place all-time. In five seasons, Hall has nine combined kick return touchdowns.

DEION SANDERS, Baltimore, needs one interception return for a touchdown to pass Ken Houston (9) and Aeneas Williams (9) to move into second place all-time. In 13 seasons, Sanders has nine interception returns for touchdowns.
