2005 KICKOFF WEEKEND NOTES

It's a special time, Kickoff Weekend, which begins on Thursday, September 8 this season in primetime. Everybody's ready!

"Every game matters and this is the first one," says Green Bay Packers head coach **MIKE SHERMAN**. "You want to get off to a good start."

Some clubs have excelled in openers. Some notable active NFL kickoff streaks:

- The Super Bowl champion **NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS**, who host the Oakland Raiders in the spotlight Kickoff 2005 game on Thursday night September 8, have won eight of their past 10 home openers, and own a perfect 3-0 record at Gillette Stadium.
- The **OAKLAND RAIDERS** are 28-6-1 (.814) in home openers since 1970.
- Since the 1970 merger, the **MIAMI DOLPHINS** are 29-6 (.829) in home openers, the best mark in the NFL during that time. The Dolphins own a 22-16-1 (.577) opening-game mark and have won 11 of their past 13 openers.
- The **JACKSONVILLE JAGUARS** have won seven of their past nine openers for an NFL-best 7-3 (.700) opening-game record (minimum five games).
- The **DALLAS COWBOYS** have an NFC-best 30-14-1 (.682) record in openers. The Cowboys have won eight of their past 11 home openers, for an overall 24-9 (.727) home kickoff record.
- MIKE SHANAHAN, head coach of the DENVER BRONCOS, is 10-2 (.833) in career openers. The Broncos have won 13 of their past 16 openers. Denver is 28-6-1 (.814) in home openers since 1970. Denver has won four openers in a row, the longest current streak in the NFL.
- The **INDIANAPOLIS COLTS**, who travel to Baltimore to face the Ravens for a Sunday night matchup, have won five of their past six openers.
- The CHICAGO BEARS and NEW YORK GIANTS have each won 40 openers, the most wins on Kickoff Weekend by any team
- MARTY SCHOTTENHEIMER, head coach of the SAN DIEGO CHARGERS, has 11 Kickoff Weekend wins, the most among active NFL coaches.
- The **NEW YORK JETS**, who visit Arrowhead Stadium to face the Kansas City Chiefs in Week 1, open the season on the road for the 34th time in the club's 46-year history.
- The ST. LOUIS RAMS have won nine of their past 13 openers and eight of their past 10 openers in St. Louis.
- NFC NORTH DIVISION STREAKS: The MINNESOTA VIKINGS have won 15 of their past 18 home openers. The CHICAGO BEARS have won 15 of their last 21 home openers. The DETROIT LIONS have won 10 of their past 14 home openers. The GREEN BAY PACKERS have won six of their past nine home openers.
- HOME SWEET HOME: The KANSAS CITY CHIEFS have won 12 of their past 16 home openers. The SAN FRANCISCO 49ERS have won nine of their last 12 home openers, outscoring opponents 366-226 in those games. The SAN DIEGO CHARGERS have won eight of their past 12 home openers. The NEW ORLEANS SAINTS have won five of their past seven home openers.
- **ROAD WARRIORS**: The **ARIZONA CARDINALS** open the season in New York against the Giants, the 17th time in the past 18 years they have opened on the road.

In the NFL, says **BILL BELICHICK**, head coach of the Super Bowl XXXIX champion New England Patriots, "every game is important. Each one matters. In this league, the most important game is the next one you play."
