

TURNAROUND NICK

When it comes to growing football programs, NICK SABAN has a green thumb.

The hard-nosed coach has restored winning traditions to three different universities and seeks in 2005 to do the same to the Miami Dolphins as the club's sixth-ever head coach.

A lot of production comes from Saban's work ethic. "Basically, if anybody doesn't want to work hard or be committed to the way he's committed, then they're going to have a problem with him," says New England Patriots coach **BILL BELICHICK**. "Now if they like to work, they won't have any problems with him at all."

At Toledo, Michigan State and LSU, Saban presided over 11 winning seasons, a share of the national championship at LSU in 2004, and three turnarounds.

In the NFL, as the <u>Cleveland Browns</u> defensive coordinator under then head coach Bill Belichick from 1991-94, Saban turned a defense that in 1990 allowed the most points in the league into one of the stingiest in the NFL.

Two coaches, 35 seasons.

That should say enough about the PITTSBURGH STEELERS' belief in steadfastness and the team's ability to pick head coaches.

"I just think you have to have patience and stability," says Steelers' chairman **DAN ROONEY**. "The teams that change coaches are starting over again."

First **CHUCK NOLL** thrived in the Steel City from 1969-91, and now **BILL COWHER** is doing the same. Starting his 14th season with the Steelers, Cowher is the most tenured active coach with one team in the NFL and the eighth-most tenured, one-team coach in history.

"A lot of guys like playing for coach Cowher, and that's why he's here," says Steelers wide receiver **HINES WARD**. "Everybody knows that when you come to the Steelers, you are going to go by his game plan. You can't try to come in and change it because you won't be around too long."
