<u>Statement by NFL Vice President of Officiating Mike Pereira</u> On Troy Polamalu Play in Yesterday's Steelers-Colts Game

"The definition of a catch – or in this case an interception – states that in the process of making the catch a player must maintain possession of the ball after he contacts the ground. The initial call on the field was that Troy Polamalu intercepted the pass because he maintained possession of the ball after hitting the ground. The replay showed that Polamalu had rolled over and was rising to his feet when the ball came loose. He maintained possession long enough to establish a catch. Therefore, the replay review should have upheld the call on the field that it was a catch and fumble.

"The rule regarding the performing of an act common to the game applies when there is contact with a defensive player and the ball comes loose, which did not happen here."
