INDIANAPOLIS COLTS QB PEYTON MANNING LEADS PRO BOWL CHARGE WITH TWO WEEKS OF VOTING REMAINING

***43.5 MILLION VOTES CAST ON MORE THAN 1,351,000 BALLOTS;
WIRELESS VOTING UP NEARLY 200%***

***PEYTON MANNING AND DREW BREES RANK 1-2
IN SPRINT WIRELESS BALLOTING***

VOTING CONTINUES ON NFL.COM, IN STADIUMS & VIA SPRINT AND NEXTEL WIRELESS**

Indianapolis Colts quarterback **PEYTON MANNING**, with 721,342 votes, leads all NFL All-Stars in balloting for the 2007 Pro Bowl, NFL.com announced today. Presented by Sprint, 2007 Pro Bowl voting will continue on NFL.com, in stadiums and via Sprint and Nextel wireless service through Friday, December 15.

There have been **43.5 million votes** cast on NFL.com and via Sprint and Nextel wireless service using more than **1,351,000 ballots**. **Wireless voting is up 198%** over this time last season.

San Diego Chargers running back **LA DAINIAN TOMLINSON** (625,067 votes) ranks second overall while, New York Giants running back **TIKI BARBER** (552,577), Philadelphia Eagles quarterback **DONOVAN MC NABB** (469,510) and Indianapolis Colts wide receiver **MARVIN HARRISON** (461,342) round out the top five.

The teams will be announced at 4 p.m. (ET) Tuesday, Dec. 19 on a special *NFL Total Access* 2007 Pro Bowl Selection Show on NFL Network. The Pro Bowl will be played at Aloha Stadium in Honolulu, Hawaii on Saturday, February 10 and televised by CBS.

In addition to casting ballots on NFL.com and in stadiums, fans can cast their Pro Bowl ballot by sending the text message "PRO" to 7777 from a phone with Sprint or Nextel wireless service to vote for their favorite players at select positions. Standard text messaging and data rates apply.

Fans who vote for their Pro Bowl players then will be able to enter for a chance to win a trip to the Pro Bowl in the 2007 NFL Pro Bowl Sweepstakes presented by Sprint. The Grand Prize includes an all-expense paid 5-day, 4-night trip for the winner and three friends to the Pro Bowl in Honolulu. In addition to air transportation, ground transportation, hotel accommodations and four game tickets, the

winner and guests will experience an insider tour of the sidelines and locker room at Aloha Stadium. There is no purchase necessary to enter or win. See NFL.com for details.

The AFC and NFC All-Star squads are made up of the consensus votes of fans, players and coaches. Each group's vote counts one-third towards determining the 43-man rosters that represent the American Football Conference and National Football Conference in the Pro Bowl. NFL players and coaches will cast their votes Dec. 14-15.

The NFL is the only sports league that combines voting by fans, coaches and players to determine its all-star teams. It was the first professional sports league to offer online all-star voting in 1995.
