Media Conference Call Advisory:

WARREN MOON, member of the Pro Football Hall of Fame Class of 2006, will be featured in an NFL media conference call Friday, July 14, at 3:30 p.m.ET.

Among the most prolific passers in pro football history, Moon played 23 seasons (six CFL, 17 NFL). From 1978-83, the Los Angeles native played for the Edmonton Eskimos of the CFL, leading the team to five consecutive Grey Cup victories. Moon returned to the United States in 1984 to join the NFL's Houston Oilers. In his 17-year NFL career (1984-2000), Moon totaled nearly 50,000 passing yards (49,325), was selected to play in nine Pro Bowls, and helped his teams reach the playoffs nine times.

Moon posted 4,000-plus passing-yard seasons in 1990 (4,689) and 1991 (4,690), respectively, joining Dan Marino and Dan Fouts as the third quarterback in NFL history to pass for more than 4,000 yards in consecutive seasons. Despite spending his first six pro seasons in the CFL, Moon ranked third all-time in NFL passing yardage and fourth in touchdown passes (291) at the time of his retirement. He is the first modern-era African American quarterback elected to the Hall of Fame.
