- **Reid** - Has the highest win total and winning percentage of any head coach in Eagles history ... has the 3rd-highest career winning percentage of all active NFL head coaches ... among NFL coaches, is tied for the 2nd-most combined wins (82) since 2000 ... in his 15-year NFL career, his teams have reached the playoffs 12 times (16-10 record)... Reached the 50-win plateau faster than any coach in franchise history (in 81 games), Dick Vermeil did so in 88 games ... has the most playoff wins in team history (7) ... named NFL COY in 2000 and 2002.
- **Coughlin** - A former Giants assistant on their Super Bowl XXV champion squad, returned to New York after nine seasons as the Jaguars head coach in 2004 and has led the Giants to the playoffs in each of the last two seasons.

The 2006 NFC East Champion Eagles square off with a familiar rival, the New York Giants, in a NFC Wild Card contest this Sunday in Philadelphia. The Eagles enter the playoffs riding a five-game winning streak, their longest streak to end a season since 1949 when the team won eight straight and went on to win the NFL Championship. Andy Reid's Eagles have been victorious in their first matchup of each of the five postseasons the team has qualified for.

LOCKED AND LOADED

With the recent signings of LG **Todd Herremans**, DE **Trent Cole**, DT **Mike Patterson** and WR **Reggie Brown** to long-term contract extensions, the Eagles continue to show their penchant for being one of the league's best franchises at locking up their young talent.

Since June, the Eagles have signed the following eight key players to contract extensions: Brown (through 2014), Cole (2013), Patterson (2016), Herremans (2013), G/T **Shawn Andrews** (2015), C **Jamaal Jackson** (2013), FS **Brian Dawkins** (2008), and P **Dirk Johnson** (2011).

NOTABLE CONNECTIONS

- ▶ **TRADING SPACES** - Eagles SAM LB **Dhani Jones** was originally a 6th round draft pick of the Giants in 2000. As a Giant, he started 30 games and tallied 269 tackles, 3 sacks and 2 INTs.

Giants LB **Carlos Emmons** totaled 441 tackles, 5 sacks and 2 INTs in 4 seasons as an Eagle (2000-03).

Eagles CB **William James** was a third round draft pick of the Giants in 2001 and played for the Giants until 2005.

- ▶ **OH, CANADA** - Eagles QB **Jeff Garcia** was coached by Giants offensive coordinator **John Hufnagel** when Garcia was a QB for the Calgary Stampeders of the CFL from 1994-96.

- ▶ **JERSEY GUY** - Eagles TE **L.J. Smith** was born in New Brunswick, NJ, and attended Highland Park HS. Smith also attended Rutgers.

- ▶ **FORMER EAGLES** - Giants P **Jeff Feagles** played for the Eagles from 1990-1993. In that span, he led the NFL in punts downed inside the 20-yard line from 1991-1993. QB **Tim Hasselbeck** attended training camp with the Eagles in 2002 & 2003. In 2002, was on the Eagles practice squad for one week and then promoted to the active roster and appeared in 2 games.

- ▶ **PHILLY AREA GUYS** - Giants vice president and general manager **Ernie Accorsi** was born in Hershey, PA. He worked as a sports writer for the Philadelphia Inquirer and in the athletic department at St. Joseph's University. Giants FB **Jim Finn** played collegiately at Penn.

- ▶ **COACHES CORNER** - Giants head coach **Tom Coughlin** was the Eagles wide receivers coach from 1984 to 1985. Coughlin also coached Eagles defensive assistant/quality control coach **Mike Reed** at Boston College when Coughlin was the head coach and Reed was a starting CB. Giants secondary/CBs coach **Peter Giunta** coached TEs/WRs at Lehigh from 1988-90 and later coached DBs for the Eagles from 1991-94. Giants defensive coordinator **Tim Lewis** was born in Quakertown, PA. Lewis also coached with Eagles WR coach **David Culley**, from 1996-98, when both were coaches with the Steelers.

- ▶ **MIAMI MEN** - Eagles DE **Jerome McDougle** and Giants DE **William Joseph** played on the same defensive line for the 2001 National Champion Miami Hurricanes. Giants TE **Jeremy Shockey** was also a member of that team.

- ▶ **MICHIGAN MEN** - Giants K **Jay Feely** and Eagles LB **Dhani Jones** were teammates at Michigan.

- ▶ **SCARLET KNIGHTS** - Eagles TE **L.J. Smith** and Giants C **Shaun O'Hara** were teammates at Rutgers.

- ▶ **WAR EAGLES** - Eagles CB **Rod Hood** and Giants LB **Reggie Torbor** and WR **Tim Carter** were all teammates at Auburn.

WORST TO FIRST

For the first time in team history, the Eagles climbed out of a last place finish in their division/conference to win it the following year. The Eagles were 6-10 in 2005 and finished in fourth place in the NFC East. The New Orleans Saints also improved from a 3-13, last place record in 2005 to finish in first place this year at 10-6. This is the fourth straight year in which two NFL teams have accomplished that feat in the same season. The only other NFC East team to go from worst to first was the 1997 New York Giants.

The turn-around was made possible as the Eagles concluded the regular season with a five-game winning streak for the first time since 1949, when they finished with eight straight victories. That year, the Eagles went on to win the NFL championship with a 14-0 win over the Los Angeles Rams.

A Nice Place to Be

Once again, the Eagles are sitting on a familiar perch - alone atop the NFC East. The Eagles have held or shared the top spot in the NFC East for 64 of the last 97 weeks of the regular season, dating back to 2001.

In 2001, the Eagles were in first place for 15 of 17 weeks, including the final 12 weeks of the season.

In 2002, the Eagles moved into a tie for first on the second week of the season and did not relinquish the spot for the remaining 16 weeks.

In 2003 after a 0-2 start, the Eagles moved into first place in week 11 and held it for the remaining 7 weeks.

In 2004 on the strength of a franchise record 7-0 start, the Eagles were atop the division for all 17 weeks.

In 2005, they held on to a share of 1st for 4 of the first 7 weeks before falling out of the race completely.

The Eagles were in first place in 2006 for the first five weeks of the season and recaptured the top spot again in weeks 16-17.

LURIE'S LANDMARKS

- **DIVISION DOMINANCE** - In 2006, Philadelphia captured their 7th NFC East Division title since the NFL-AFL merger in 1970. The Eagles and the New England Patriots have each won their respective divisions five out of the last six years. Prior to that, the last NFL team to accomplish that feat was the Dallas Cowboys, who won five straight division titles from 1992-96.

From 2001-2004, the Eagles captured the NFC East title in four consecutive seasons for the first time in team history, becoming the first team to win the NFC East four straight years since Dallas' stint from 1992-96.

The last team to win a division 4 years in a row was Pittsburgh from 1994-97. The Eagles also became just the 8th team since the NFL went to a 16-game schedule in 1978 to win 4-or-more consecutive division titles.

- **A SUPER EXPERIENCE** - With a NFC Championship and an appearance in Super Bowl 39, Lurie became just the second owner in team history to lead a team to the Super Bowl.
- **POSTSEASON PROWESS** - Since 1995, Lurie's first full year as owner of the Eagles, no team has appeared in the postseason more than Philadelphia (eight out of 12 seasons). From 1999-2004, the Eagles set a franchise record with five straight playoff appearances.
- **OUTSTANDING OWNERSHIP** - With an 8-7 record in the playoffs during Lurie's tenure as owner, the Eagles have won and played in more postseason games than any ownership group in its history.
- **100 WINS** - With a win over the Houston Texans in the 2006 season opener, Jeffrey Lurie registered his 100th regular season win as owner of the Philadelphia Eagles since 1995 (his first full year of ownership).
- **A NICE RUN** - With 59 regular season wins from 2000-04, the Eagles completed their most successful five-year stretch ever.

The Eagles won at least 12 games in 3 successive seasons. They joined 5 other squads as the only NFL teams to do so (Oak. 1967-69, Mia. 1983-85, Dal. 1992-95, SF 1996-98, and Denver 1996-98). Only Dallas has done it more than three straight.

The Eagles reached double-digit wins in five consecutive seasons (2000-04). The last team to claim that was the San Francisco 49ers, who did it for 16 straight seasons from 1983-98.

With 13 victories in 2004, the Eagles maintained or improved their win total for an NFL-record 6th straight season (joining Phi. 1939-45, Bal. 1953-59, and GB 1991-97).

BIG RED'S MACHINE

One of the most successful head coaches in recent NFL history, **Andy Reid** entered the 2006 season faced with a challenge he had not seen since his second season with the Eagles, rebounding after a losing campaign. Reid took over a 3-13 club on 1/11/99, and was simply masterful leading the Eagles to a NFC Championship just six seasons later. The Philadelphia fans hoped he could work the same magic he did when he first took over the team. The first part of that equation has been solved. The Eagles captured their 5th NFC East title in six years under Reid in 2006.

Reid knew he had to gather the troops and get everybody on the right course. He began that chore at the beginning of the team's first mini-camp of 2006.

"They were on board," said Reid. "It wasn't something where I had to bang on the table or anything."

Once he felt that he had the players focused on the task at hand, he laid out his next course of action.

"Then," he said, "you kind of see how the events go and you make sure you kind of stick to your beliefs and do what got you here. I think that's maybe the O-line-man in (me). You simplify it and take care of the things you can control and get rid of the things you can't and move on."

During his tenure, Reid has recorded the highest win total and winning percentage in team history as well as the 3rd-highest overall percentage among any active NFL coach through the 2006 season (see chart).

Along the way he has captured 5 division titles in 6 years, including 4 consecutive division titles (2001-04), 4 trips to the NFC Championship game, the most playoff wins (7) in club history and led the team to its first Super Bowl appearance since 1980. He was named NFL coach of the year following the 2000 and 2002 seasons.

THE BIG GUY'S BIG MOMENTS

Already the franchise leader in overall career win percentage (87-53, .621), **Andy Reid** joined Greasy Neale (111) and Dick Vermeil (101) in 2005, as the only Eagles head coaches to have led the team in 100-or-more regular season games.

In the first 100 games of their Eagles coaching careers, Neale and Vermeil had posted 57 and 54 wins respectively. Reid posted 67 wins in his first 100 regular season games.

Reid is also the leader in career regular season win percentage among the three most successful coaches in franchise history.

THE BIG KID'S BIG SEASON

One year removed from being named as an alternate to the NFC Pro Bowl roster, a season worthy of a seven-year contract extension that will keep him in Philadelphia through 2015, Eagles RG **Shawn Andrews** was selected as a starter on this year's roster by his peers.



Andrews credits a more slender physique with allowing him to be more of a "mauler" this season. After the sudden death of a childhood friend who was battling weight issues, Andrews learned from what his friend went through and reported to training camp 40 pounds lighter and motivated to keep the weight off.

"I want it to be that when you talk about Shawn Andrews, it's not going to be, 'Oh, he's back up to 380 lbs. again,'" Andrews said earlier this year. "It's going to be, 'Wow, this guy is a phenom. He's [24] years old and he is kicking butt.' It's not something I can ask or tell people to do. It's something that I have to prove."

Prove it he has. After being selected with the 16th overall pick in the 2004 draft by the Eagles, Andrews was the team's opening-day starter that year but suffered a fractured fibula in his right leg in that game. The injury shelved Andrews for his entire rookie season, but since his return in 2005, he has gone on to start all 32 games for the Eagles at RG.

Prior to the 2006 season, an almost prophetic Jeremiah Trotter talked about Andrews' potential, "He'll be in Hawaii. Last year he got first alternate and he wasn't even in shape. So, the way he's working, he'll be crossing the water this year just because of the sheer ability he has and the way he can move guys."

THE CENTURY CLUB

Not many teams in the NFL can boast the type of offensive tackle tandem the Philadelphia Eagles trot out onto the field each week. Not only are **Jon Runyan** (6-7, 330) and **William Thomas** (6-7, 335) a physically imposing tandem, but they are an extremely reliable and durable pair as well. With the completion of the 2006 season, Runyan and Thomas have started 104 games together as the Eagles offensive tackles.

TANDEM TIDBITS

- **100 GAMES** - When Runyan and Thomas took their spots on the offensive line at Was. (12/10/06) they did so for the 100th time as a duo. In those 100 games, the Eagles compiled a 68-32 record (.680). The duo surpassed former Eagles Jerry Sisemore and Stan Walters (95 starts together) for most games played as a tackle combo in franchise history.
- **IRON MAN** - Runyan has started 160 straight games (112 as a member of the Eagles), good for the 4th-longest streak among active NFL players, trailing only Brett Favre of the Packers (237), Will Shields of the Chiefs (223) and Derrick Brooks of the Buccaneers (176).

This week, Runyan prepares to play in his 17th postseason contest since 1999, the most by any player in the NFL in that span.

Said Eagles head coach Andy Reid of Runyan's streak, "Not every one of those games he has felt great. There's a toughness that comes in there and he is one of the tougher guys I have been around. He's mentally strong and the way he plays the game, it's amazing that he has been able to play all those games because he plays reckless football and he is 6'8". There's a lot of area there to hit and hurt."

- **STABLE STARTER** - Thomas has started all but one game he has been active for in his Eagles career. A member of the Eagles since 1998, Thomas has started 134 games for the Eagles and has only missed nine. He currently ranks 4th on the Eagles all-time list for games played by an offensive lineman.

THE ULTIMATE WEAPON

RB **Brian Westbrook** is the Eagles "Ultimate Weapon," making plays through the air as well as on the ground. With 1,217 yards rushing and 699 yards receiving in 2006, he not only became the Eagles 7th 1,000-yd. rusher, he also became the first player to rush for 1,000 yds. and receive for 600 yds. Among the 14 1,000-yd. performances in team history, Westbrook's 5.1 yds./carry average was the best by any back to accomplish the feat.

"Brian Westbrook is arguably the best receiver as a tailback in the NFL," wrote ESPN.com NFL writer Len Pasquarelli. "His water-bug quickness in space, where opponents never quite seem to figure out how to cover him, makes him the Eagles most compelling offensive playmaker."

- ▶ Since becoming a full-time starter in 2004, has amassed 4,664 yds. from scrimmage in just 40 games, the 6th-highest total in the NFL.
- ▶ With 9 career 100-yd. rushing games, ranks 5th in team history. His 6 in 2006 tied for the 3rd-most in a season by an Eagles RB. He was just the 3rd Eagle to rush for 6-or-more 100-yd. games in a season (Ricky Watters had 6 in '96 & Wilbert Montgomery had 6 in '78, 7 in '79 and 8 in '81).
- ▶ Is the only active NFL player with 15-or-more TDs both rushing and receiving (20 rushing & 18 receiving).
- ▶ Finished 2006 with 1,916 total yards from scrimmage, despite missing nearly 2 games of action. Westbrook was deactivated vs. GB (10/2/06) with knee inflammation, while he saw just one series of action in the season finale vs. Atl. Montgomery did play in all 16 games that year.

GARCIA'S GUIDANCE

QB **Jeff Garcia** was a more than sufficient replacement for injured QB **Donovan McNabb** down the stretch in 2006. In seven games (6 starts), he threw 10 TD passes and only two INTs. Most importantly, he led the Eagles to a 5-1 record and an NFC East division championship.

"You really see his veteran experience come into play," said Eagles head coach Andy Reid. "When you lose a quarterback like Donovan that's not always the case. But in Jeff you've got somebody who steps up and grabs everybody and shakes them a little and says, 'Let's go, we're going to be all right,' and pushes them ahead."

In his first three starts, Garcia posted a 100-plus passer rating (121.0, 105.9, and 115.1), becoming the first Eagles QB, since the NFL merger in 1970, to do so and the first player in the NFL since the Jets Chad Pennington did it in his first four starts in 2002. In all, 7 QBs have accomplished that feat since 1970.

In the second half of the 2006 season, Garcia had the 3rd-best QB rating in the NFL (96.3) and the 2nd-best in the NFC, trailing only Saints QB Drew Brees. In that same span, Garcia threw the least INTs (2) of any QB in the league.

GARCIA'S 2006 HIGHLIGHTS

- ▶ Accounted for 281 yards of offense, 238 passing and 43 rushing (his most on the ground as an Eagle).
- ▶ Led the offense on an 8-play, 80-yd. fourth quarter TD drive, culminating in a 19-yd. TD strike to WR Reggie Brown that put the Eagles up for good at NYG (12/17/06). Garcia completed 4 of 4 passes for 63 yards on the drive.
- ▶ Had a career-best streak of 164 pass attempts without an INT snapped at NYG (12/17/06).
- ▶ Passed for 300 yds. for the first time since 10/17/04 vs. Cin. (with Cle.) as he completed 21 of 39 passes for 312 yds. and 3 TDs. In doing so, became the first Eagles QB other than McNabb to throw for 300 yds. since Bobby Hoying in 1997.
- ▶ In his first NFL start since 12/18/05 vs. Cin. as a member of the Lions, was 19 of 23 passing for 140 yards and 3 TDs. His 82.6% completion percentage was the best of his career.

SPREADING THE WEALTH

The Eagles offense was not only an explosive offense in 2006, it was also an equal-opportunity offense.

For just the second time in franchise history the Eagles had four receivers with more than 600 receiving yards. The only other time it had occurred was in 1990.

NOT YOUR REGG-ULAR WORK ETHIC

Now that WR **Reggie Brown** has settled into his starting role in the Eagles offense, the NFL community is getting a chance to see the hard-nosed work ethic that the Eagles organization saw when they decided to select him in the 2nd round of the 2005 draft with the 35th overall pick. Brown made a living in 2006 picking up the tough yards, converting first downs and outracing defenders with a no-quit style of play.

"He's a real smart kid," said head coach **Andy Reid**. "He'll work as hard or harder than anybody on this team at what he does. He's hard to tire out. When Jon Gruden had him at the Senior Bowl, that was the thing he told me, 'You can't wear this guy out. He just keeps rolling.' And that's how he is. He just pushes and pushes every play." "I've always been obsessed with working out," said Brown. "I always felt the extra work would do nothing but make me better...When I work out, I work out hard. That's why I like working out alone. There are no distractions.

"I think what makes him a good receiver," said offensive coordinator **Marty Mornhinweg**, "and what will make him even better as he matures in the NFL, is his gut instinct."

WR **Donté Stallworth** made a significant impact in the Eagles offense in 2006, utilizing his game-breaking speed and knack for finding the open holes in the defense. Stallworth caught 38 passes for 725 yds. and 5 TDs on the season. He also had 14 receptions of 20-or-more yds. and 4 of 40-or-more.

"People talk about that second gear," said FS **Brian Dawkins**, "he has that third gear that you can get to and fourth gear if he ever needs to. He definitely has that home run hitting ability at any given time once he is on the field."

STALLWORTH'S 2006 HIGHLIGHTS

- Led NFL in yds./catch average (19.1) among players with at least 35 receptions.

Only Bobby Walston (9) has led an Eagles team in scoring more times than Akers. In those seven seasons, Akers has exceeded the 100-point mark on six occasions, more than any other Eagles player, including five straight seasons from 2000-04. No other Eagle has reached the 100-point plateau more than twice. Akers' only sub-100-point season came in 2005 when he missed four games with a hamstring injury.

It seemed fitting that on the eve of his 11th season in the NFL, in the small Ohio town made famous by the Hall of Fame dedicated to the greats of professional football, on a field adjacent to that mecca, the team announced that FS **Brian Dawkins** will remain an Eagle for at least another



three seasons. Just months later his peers selected him as a starter in his 6th Pro Bowl, his 3rd straight. It will be in Philadelphia that he will continue to prepare his resume, so that one day he will join the proud brotherhood of Hall of Famers in Canton.

Many have credited Dawkins with revolutionizing the safety position. Defensive coordinator Jim Johnson has been able to deploy him as a devastating blitzter, a significant force against the toughest of running teams and as one of the best pass defenders to ever roam a secondary as a safety.

"With creative defensive coordinator Jim Johnson using him as a versatile wind-up toy, Dawkins was a catalyst for the makeover of the safety position," said ESPN.com writer Len Pasquarelli. "For years, he was the face of change, the man who most represented the redefinition of a position that had waned in significance around the NFL."

One great example of how frustrating Dawkins can be for opposing offenses is the number of total interceptions and forced fumbles he has tallied in his career.

With a combined 64 "disruptive plays" (interceptions and forced fumbles), Dawkins has tallied more than any other Eagle since 1982 (when the Eagles began keeping forced fumbles as an official stat).

THE LITO SHUFFLE

Although CB **Lito Sheppard** missed three games in 2006 due to a sprained ankle, he provided the Eagles defense with a spark on several occasions. Enough of a spark, that he was selected to his 2nd Pro Bowl in just his 5th year in the league. In 2006 he ranked tied for 7th in the NFL with 6 INTs and was 2nd in the league in INT return yards (157). He also moved his way up the Eagles all-time list for INT return yards and currently ranks 4th (435). Sheppard has now returned three INTs for TDs tying Joe Scarpati for 2nd on the Eagles all-time list.

THE AXEMAN'S READY TO SWING

Four-time Pro Bowl middle linebacker **Jeremiah Trotter** takes a blue-collar attitude with him to work every day. Despite all the accolades he has garnered over the years in Philadelphia, Trotter knows Pro Bowls, tackles, sacks and interceptions don't keep you in the NFL forever.

"I was in the training room one day and everyone was real quiet and it was early in the morning," remembered Trotter. "You know how it is, it was right before practice and I was trying to liven the guys up. I said, 'Listen, I've been cut before. It ain't a good feeling. You have to be excited to be here and take advantage of the opportunity to get better.' Every chance you can get to be out here, you have to look at it as an opportunity to get better. You don't want to be sitting at home wishing you did something different."

Those are strong words to preach in a locker room full of professional athletes and grown men; words that not many have the credibility to get away with. But, Trotter is one of the few, having averaged over 156 tackles a season as an Eagle since becoming a full-time starter in 1999. One of the toughest players in the NFL, he has battled lingering knee issues to go on to start 114 games over the last 8 seasons.

"I think he has great intensity," said defensive coordinator **Jim Johnson**. "He's always had good intensity, his focus is so much better. I think after last year he just wants to play better and I just see a great focus and much more intensity."

- ▶ Recorded a season-high 16 tackles at NO (10/15/06), the most since 10/24/04 at Cle., and 14 tackles at TB (10/22/0).

DOWN THE STRETCH THEY COME

Andy Reid has engineered one of the most successful teams in the NFL in the second half of the season since 2000.

In the months of November and December, the Eagles are 2nd in the NFL in overall winning percentage (.724) and hold the NFL's best road winning percentage (.742), during that span. Philadelphia also ranks 5th in the NFL since 2000 with a .704 winning percentage at home, as the temperature decreases.

Under Reid, the Eagles have been extremely successful against NFC East foes in November and December. Since 1999, the Eagles are 20-8 against the NFC East and the only team in the division with a winning record in divisional games in those two months.

(10/8/06), Baskett hauled in an 87-yard TD from QB Donovan McNabb, good for the second-longest pass play of 2006. With those two receptions, Baskett became the first Eagle to catch two TDs of 80-yards-or-more in the same season.

Baskett's Big Day - Baskett's big day against the Falcons didn't stop with his 89-yard TD catch. In addition, he grabbed 7 passes for 177 yards, the third-highest total in the NFC in 2006. His 177 receiving yards was the most in a game by an Eagle since Fred Barnett's 187 yards vs. Hou. (10/24/94), and the most by an Eagles rookie since Don Looney caught 14 passes for 180 yards at Was. (12/1/40).

Not Bad...For A Rookie - Baskett became the 2nd rookie in NFL history to post two TD receptions of 85-yards-or-more in a single season. The Packers Billy Howton was the first rookie to accomplish the feat, doing so in 1952. In addition, Baskett's 177 yards are the most in a game by an undrafted rookie WR since the Cowboys James Dixon posted 203 receiving yards at Pho. (11/12/89).

20/20 Club - Baskett joined Saints WR Devery Henderson as the only WRs in the NFL (with at least 20 receptions) to average over 20 yards per catch. Baskett averaged 21.1 yards per catch, finishing second to Henderson's mark of 23.3.

- **THREE'S COMPANY** - The Eagles had three different QBs (McNabb, Garcia, Feeley) throw for more than 300 yards in a game in 2006. It is just the second time since 1998 that a team has had three different 300-yard passers (2005 Rams - Marc Bulger, Jamie Martin, Ryan Fitzpatrick).
- **LOVE FOR THE O-LINE** - The Eagles starting offensive line of LT **William Thomas**, LG **Todd Herremans**, C **Jamaal Jackson**, RG **Shawn Andrews** and RT **Jon Runyan** became the 2nd unit in team history to start all 16 games in a season. The 2000 line of LT Thomas, LG John Welbourn, C Bubba Miller, RG Jermaine Mayberry and RT Runyan also accomplished that feat.

The line also joined the Dallas Cowboys as the only two offensive line units to start all 16 regular season games in 2006.

In addition, the Eagles offensive line allowed opponents to sack their quarterback just 28 times in 2006, the lowest total by an Eagles O-Line since 1981 when they allowed their QBs to be sacked just 22 times. It was the 6th-lowest sack total allowed in Eagles history since records began being kept of the stat in 1963.

- **3.5 MILES OF OFFENSE** - The Eagles set a team record with 3.5 miles of offense, or in NFL terms, 6,103 total net yards of offense. Their previous best, 5,766 yards, was set in 1980.
- **BUSY SCOREBOARD OPERATOR** - The Eagles scored the second most points in team history in 2006, putting 398 points on the board, trailing only the 2002 team who accounted for 415 points. The 398 points were good for 3rd in the NFC in 2006.
- **CLOSING IT OUT** - Both QB **Donovan McNabb** and QB **Jeff Garcia** finished 2006 ranked in the top 10 in the NFL in fourth quarter passer rating. McNabb (110.3) ranked 2nd and Garcia (95.9) ranked 8th. The two ranked 1st and 3rd, respectively, in the NFC.
- **MOVING THE CHAINS** - The Eagles converted 42.1% (88-for-209) of their third down opportunities in 2006. The 42.1% conversion total was the second best mark by an Eagles team since 1981, when they converted 44.4% (95-for-214) of their chances.

INSIDE THE HASHES

- **A FEELEY GOOD STORY** - QB **A.J. Feeley** closed out 2006 by throwing for a career-high 321 yards vs. Atl. (12/31/06). His 3 TD passes against the Falcons tied a career-high and his 128.5 QB rating set a career-high for games in which he attempted 10-or-more passes.
- **G-LEW, THE GO-TO GUY** - Of the 24 catches WR **Greg Lewis** had in 2006, 20 of them were good for a first down (13 of which came on third down). 83.3% of his catches going for a first down was the highest mark on the team in 2006.
- **TRENDY TRENT** - DE **Trent Cole** finished 2006 ranked 11th in the NFC in sacks (8.0). He began the season by registering at least a full sack in each of the first three games of the year.

Cole's Season Highlights

- Intercepted an errant Eli Manning pass, thanks to pressure from CB **Sheldon Brown**, and returned it 19 yards to cap a 36-22 Eagles victory at NYG (12/17/06). The INT and TD were career firsts for Cole.
- Notched 2.0 sacks of Eli Manning vs. NYG (9/17/06). It was the 4th time in 17 career games that Cole had a multi-sack game. Coincidentally, all four games came against a QB who was the #1 overall draft choice - Eli Manning (2004) twice, David Carr (2002), and Drew Bledsoe (1993).
- **OMAR'S UNO'S** - Weeks 13-15 of the Eagles 2006 season became back-to-back-to-back weeks of firsts for Eagles rookie LB **Omar Gaither**. First, he made his first NFL start at the WILL LB vs. Car. (12/4/06). Then came his first-career interception at Was. (12/10/06) off of QB Jason Campbell. The INT gave the Eagles great field position at the Redskin 31-yard line, and led to the their first score of the day, a 10-yd. TD strike from QB **Jeff Garcia** to TE **L.J. Smith**.

To cap off the trio of firsts, Gaither notched the first sack of his NFL career, knocking Giants QB Eli Manning to the Meadowlands turf for a 12-yd. loss. He became the first Eagles rookie LB since Ray Farmer in 1996 to record a sack.

- **WALKIN' THE WALK** - DT **Darwin Walker** has quietly been one of the most effective passing rushing defensive tackles in the NFL since 2002, currently ranking 5th in the league in sacks (26.5) since that time.

- **TAKING IT THE DISTANCE** - With S **Michael Lewis'** 84-yd. INT return in the 2nd quarter at Was. (12/10/06), the Eagles became just the second team in NFL history to have 3 different players record a 70-yd. INT return in the same season. Lewis joined fellow DBs **Lito Sheppard** (102-yd. INT vs. Dal.) and **Sheldon Brown** (70-yd. INT vs. Was.) to accomplish the feat. The Eagles joined the Green Bay Packers, who had previously accomplished the feat in 2002 as Kabeer Gbaja-Biamila, Marques Anderson and Darren Sharper each posted 70-yd. INT returns.
- **SCORE SOME FOR SCHOBEL** - TE **Matt Schobel** recorded his first two TDs as an Eagle, in back-to-back weeks, with a 25-yard TD grab from QB Jeff Garcia in the first quarter at Dal. (12/25/06) and a 14-yard TD catch from QB A.J. Feeley in the first quarter vs. Atl. (12/31/06).
- **BIRD'S FIRST'S** - S **Sean Considine** snagged his first INT and recorded the first full sack of his career vs. Atl. (12/31/06). WR **Jason Avant** caught his first-career TD vs. Atl. (12/31/06).
- **TWO FOR TWO** - DE **Juqua Thomas** tied a career-high for sacks in a game with two vs. Atl. (12/31/06), his first two-sack game as an Eagle. LB **Matt McCoy** also set a career-high for sacks in a game, by also recording two sacks vs. Atl. (12/31/06).

POSITION-BY-POSITION ROUNDUP

► QUARTERBACKS

After Donovan McNabb suffered a season-ending knee injury in week 10 vs. Tennessee, the Eagles turned the reigns of their offense over to **Jeff Garcia**, a three-time Pro Bowler, who was added as an insurance policy this past offseason.

Garcia led the Eagles to a 5-1 record in his six starts to conclude the regular season, completing 61.7% (116-188) of his passes for 10 touchdowns and just 2 interceptions. He topped the 100 QB rating mark in three of those starts and was sacked just six times.

In his first start week 11 at Indianapolis, Garcia completed a career-high 82.6% (19-23) of his passes for 140 yards and 2 TDs. A week later, he threw for 312 yards and 3 TDs in a win vs. Carolina, becoming the first Eagle not named McNabb to pass for 300 yards in a game since Bobby Hoying in 1997.

Garcia, 36, flourished in the West Coast offense under Eagles asst. head coach/offensive coordinator Marty Mornhinweg while the two were together in San Francisco. Garcia played five seasons in the CFL before joining the 49ers (1999-2003), Browns (2004), and Lions (2005).

A.J. Feeley was re-signed on August 30 after being released by San Diego. A 5th round draft pick of the Eagles in 2001, he spent three seasons in Philadelphia before being traded to Miami in 2004 for a 2nd round draft choice (Reggie Brown). After starting 8 games for the Dolphins in 2004, he was traded to San Diego on October 18, 2005. He engineered four wins in the final five games of the 2002 season for the Eagles when McNabb and Koy Detmer were injured.

In 2006, Feeley saw extensive action in the season finale vs. Atlanta, completing 22 of 33 passes for 321 yards and three touchdowns, including an 89-yarder to Hank Baskett for the longest pass play in the NFL in 2006.

Koy Detmer was re-signed by the Eagles on 1/2/07 to serve as the holder on special teams and as a back-up quarterback. Detmer, a 7th round draft pick in 1997, was released by the Eagles prior to the 2006 regular season after a nine-year stint in Philadelphia.

Injured Reserve:

For the second straight season, **Donovan McNabb** had his season cut short due to injury as he suffered a torn anterior cruciate ligament in his right knee in the 2nd quarter during the team's 10th game vs. Tennessee. He underwent reconstructive surgery by Dr. James Andrews on 11/28. At the time of the injury, McNabb had been near the top of the league's charts in passing yards (2,647), touchdown passes (18), and QB rating (95.5). Along the way, he became the 7th player in NFL history to throw for 20,000 yards and rush for 2,500 more.

In 2005, McNabb's season ended on 11/14 when he aggravated his groin and abdomen vs. Dallas and underwent season-ending surgery on 11/28 by Dr. William Meyers. Prior to that, McNabb battled the effects of a sports hernia since the start of the training camp.

A five-time Pro Bowler, McNabb has led the Eagles to four NFC Championship game appearances and more postseason wins than any other quarterback in team history. In fact, his 12 playoff starts and 7 playoff victories rank 10th and 11th, respectively, in NFL history. Along the way, McNabb has become one of the game's most recognizable superstars.

► RUNNING BACKS

One of the most electrifying players in the NFL, **Brian Westbrook** is a major part of the Eagles run and pass game. Since 2003, he has scored 40 touchdowns in 54 regular season games. "He's the ultimate weapon," said McNabb. "And talking to guys from other teams about his speed, playmaking ability, agility, and the misses he creates, just solidifies what I'm talking about."

Despite enduring swelling in his knee during a good portion of the 2006 season, Westbrook put up swollen numbers with 1,916 total yards from scrimmage and a 6.0-yard average per touch (240 rushes for a career-high 1,217 yards, 77 catches for 699 yards). Westbrook became the 7th Eagle to top the 1,000-yard rushing mark and the first since Duce Staley in 2002. His scrimmage yardage total ranked 3rd in club history (behind Wilbert Montgomery's 2,006 in 1979) and was the most by an Eagle since Montgomery's 1,923 yards in 1981. Westbrook led the Eagles with 11 touchdowns (7 rushing and 4 receiving).

In a week 7 loss at Tampa Bay, Westbrook became the 2nd Eagle ever to surpass the 100-yard mark in both rushing and receiving, joining Timmy Brown's performance vs. Pittsburgh in 1964. During weeks 9-11, Westbrook became the first Eagle since Wilbert Montgomery in 1981 to top the 100-yard mark in rushing three consecutive games.

Westbrook earned a Pro Bowl berth in 2004, his first full season as the team's featured back. The Eagles third round pick in 2002, he played collegiately at nearby Villanova where he was one of the NCAA's most decorated players.

No player is happier to be on the field this year than **Correll Buckhalter**. When healthy, he has been a productive back that possesses a good combination of size and speed. He missed three of the previous four seasons with knee injuries.

An explosive and strong runner, **Ryan Moats** was a 3rd round draft choice by the Eagles in 2005. He made the most of his opportunities as a rookie that year with 278 yards and 3 touchdowns on 55 carries (5.1 yards per carry).

A shifty back with great hands, **Reno Mahe** adds depth to the position and has also been a dependable special teams performer since signing with the Eagles as a rookie free agent in 2003. A former WR at BYU, Mahe continues to improve with a tremendous work ethic on and off the field.

A 5th round draft choice in 2004, fullback **Thomas Tapeh** saw limited action as a rookie. In his most extensive action in game 15, he dislocated his hip which sidelined him the entire 2005 season.

Injured Reserve:

Jason Davis, a rookie free agent in 2006, was a two-year starter at Illinois where he excelled as a receiver out of the backfield. He injured his knee during the preseason and was placed on IR on 8/29.

► WIDE RECEIVERS

A 2005 second round draft pick from Georgia, **Reggie Brown** broke onto the scene in his first NFL campaign, setting the Eagles record for most receptions by a rookie wide receiver with 43. Despite being a full-time starter for just the final nine games of the season, he led all NFL rookies with 571 receiving yards. "With the ball in his hands, Reggie is a guy who can make a couple of guys miss," said McNabb. "He can turn a six-yard route into a play that can go the distance."

In 2006, Brown led the team with 816 receiving yards (17.7 yards per catch) and 8 touchdown catches. He also accounted for one rushing TD. His 46 catches led all Eagles wide receivers. Brown inked a five-year contract extension through 2014 on 11/10/06.

The Eagles acquired **Donté Stallworth** from New Orleans on August 28 for LB Mark Simoneau and a conditional 4th round draft choice in 2007. One of the league's most dangerous deep threats, Stallworth is in his fifth NFL season after being drafted by the Saints with the 13th overall pick in 2002.

POSITION-BY-POSITION ROUNDUP

Stallworth battled hamstring issues early in the 2006 season, but proved to be productive when on the field. He had 38 catches for 725 yards (19.1 avg.) and five TDs. He has eclipsed the 100-yard receiving mark on three occasions.

A sure-handed receiver and precise route runner, **Greg Lewis** has shown a great deal of progress during his first three NFL seasons, after signing as a rookie free agent in 2003. After making 23 catches in limited action during his first two seasons, he stepped into a starting role in 2005 and posted career highs in receptions (48) and yards (561). Lewis is back in his familiar reserve role in 2006 and contributed 24 catches, 348 yards and two scores.

Hank Baskett was acquired for WR Billy McMullen from Minnesota, who signed him as a rookie free agent out of New Mexico. He earned a roster spot after an impressive preseason. He parlayed that success into the regular season, grabbing 22 passes for 464 yards (21.1 avg.), including a 3-112-1TD performance in a week 5 win vs. Dallas and a 7-177-1TD outing in a win vs. Atl. Baskett hauled in an 87-yard TD grab from McNabb vs. Dallas and a 89-yard TD grab from Feeley vs. Atlanta to become the first Eagle ever to grab two 80-plus-yard scoring grabs in a single season.

Rookie draft pick **Jason Avant** (D4b) finished his career at Michigan ranked 3rd in catches (169 for 2,247 yards and 13 TDs).

Injured Reserve:

Jeremy Bloom (D5a-06) battled a hamstring injury throughout the preseason and was placed on IR on 8/29. Bloom is a former US Ski Team star and participated in the 2006 Winter Olympics in Italy, placing 6th in the moguls. He was a prolific return man in his two seasons at Colorado (2002-03).

► TIGHT ENDS

One of the league's budding stars, **L.J. Smith** posted 50 catches for 611 yards and 5 TDs. The team's 2nd round draft choice out of Rutgers in 2003, Smith shared time during his first two NFL seasons with former Eagle Chad Lewis before earning a starting role a year ago. "He came in with a great work ethic," said Lewis. "And he never shied away from hard work. That's what it takes to be the best."

Matt Schobel adds another big target to the Eagles offensive arsenal and a nice compliment to Smith. A third round draft choice of the Bengals in 2002, he spent his first four NFL seasons in Cincinnati. He caught 14 passes for the Eagles in 2006, including two for touchdowns.

Injured Reserve:

Recognized as one of the best long-snappers in the game, **Mike Bartrum** has also provided the Eagles with timely and efficient play as a backup TE. His 11 career receptions have accounted for 6 TDs. He earned NFC Pro Bowl honors for his craft following the 2005 season. Bartrum suffered a season-ending neck injury in game 11 at Indianapolis.

► OFFENSIVE LINE

Over the past few years head coach Andy Reid and general manager Tom Heckert have used several draft choices on offensive linemen to infuse both youth and talent into the unit. At the forefront of that group is Pro Bowl RG **Shawn Andrews**. The Eagles first round draft choice in 2004 rebounded from a fractured fibula in his right leg during his rookie season to become a dominating force at right guard in 2005. "He's a mauler, a road grader," said Fox Sports analyst Bill Maas. "Once he gets his hands and body on you, it's over." Andrews quickly earned a starting role after an eye-popping performance during the 2004 preseason and one-year later was voted as an alternate to the NFC Pro Bowl squad. In 2006, Andrews earned his first berth as a starter on the NFC Pro Bowl squad and inked a seven-year contract extension on 6/12/06 that will keep him in Philadelphia through 2015.

The cornerstones remain **Jon Runyan** and **William Thomas**, who are in their seventh year together as the team's starting tackles. Since 2000, only two pairs of tackles have been together as long (Green Bay's Mark Tauscher and Chad Clifton, and Washington's Chris Samuels and Jon Jansen) but neither has as many regular season or postseason starts together (103 and 12, respectively) as Runyan and Thomas.

Armed with a feisty, on-field mentality, Runyan takes pride in being a physical force each and every time he exits the locker room. At 6-7, 330, his relentless, physical play has trickled down to each of his linemates. "What Jon has brought to the offensive line is that temperament of his," said Reid. "He is going to maul you and beat you up and feel pretty good about doing it. That's been contagious all the way across the line." Runyan, who suited up for the NFC's Pro Bowl squad in 2002, has started 160 straight regular season contests. He signed a three-year contract extension on 3/24/06.

Thomas has made a nice living out of being Donovan McNabb's blindside bodyguard. One of the most accomplished left tackles in team history, he is a three-time Pro Bowl selection and has been a mainstay at LT since being selected in the first round in 1998. Thomas has missed just seven games due to injury during his NFL career, including the last six of the 2005 season with a lower back injury.

A rookie free agent signee from Delaware State in 2003, **Jamaal Jackson** made the most of his first playing opportunity in the NFL in 2005. Utilizing his big frame and a strong work ethic, Jackson filled in admirably at center for Fraley for the final eight games of the season. Jackson had spent most of his rookie season on the practice squad and all of 2004 on Injured Reserve with a triceps muscle tear. His hard work and bright future resulted in a 7-year contract extension signed on 7/20/06.

A fourth round draft pick in 2005, **Todd Herremans** saw valuable action starting at LT for an injured Thomas during the preseason and in four regular season games. He showed enough promise to allow the Eagles to trade incumbent LG Artis Hicks (to Minnesota on draft day) and put him in as the starter at that position. Herremans inked a five-year contract extension on 12/30 that will keep him in Philadelphia through 2013.

Besides mining Andrews and Herremans, the 2004-06 drafts have provided the Eagles with an infusion of youth and depth on the line. G **Scott Young** (5b, BYU) was added in 2005 and saw time on the 53-man roster but did not play. In the 2006 draft, the Eagles bolstered the talent with T **Winston Justice** (2, USC) and G **Max Jean-Gilles** (4a, Georgia). The Eagles also signed rookie free agent C **Nick Cole** (New Mexico State), who also serves as a fullback on short yardage downs.

Injured Reserve:

Rookie free agent T/G **Stefan Rodgers** (Lambuth) went down with a knee injury in the preseason finale at NYJ.

► DEFENSIVE LINE

The Eagles upgraded the defensive line position with three key additions during the 2006 offseason. First, they named renowned college defensive line coach **Pete Jenkins** to their staff. Then they added one of the decade's most accomplished defensive ends in **Darren Howard** before selecting imposing DT **Brodrick Bunkley** with the 14th overall pick in the draft. Those additions have paid dividends as the D-line has registered 32 of their 40 sacks.

Howard, who inked a six-year contract with the Eagles on March 13, spent his first six NFL seasons with New Orleans, recording 44.5 sacks for the Saints. "He's a proven double-digit sack guy who can play both outside and inside in pass rush situations," said head coach Andy Reid. In 2006, Howard contributed 5 sacks, 2 forced fumbles and 2 fumbles recoveries.

POSITION-BY-POSITION ROUNDUP

Trent Cole, a 5th round draft choice in 2005, made a big impression during his rookie season, posting five sacks and earning NFL defensive rookie of the month honors in November. He earned a starting spot by season's end and finished 4th among all NFL rookies in sacks. He has posted four multi-sack games during his young career. Cole's 8 sacks in 2006 led the Eagles. He also returned an interception 19 yards for his first career touchdown to seal a win at NYG. Cole inked a five-year contract extension on 11/6 that will keep him in Philadelphia through 2013.

The Eagles first round pick in 2003, **Jerome McDougle** has battled a lion's share of adversity during his first three seasons in Philadelphia. After two injury-plagued seasons, McDougle missed the entire 2005 campaign after being shot in the abdomen during a robbery attempt on the eve of the opening day of training camp. He participated fully in all offseason workouts and practices, including Pilates and Brazilian Jiu-Jitsu, en route to his return to the playing field.

Juqua Thomas is in his 2nd season as an Eagle after four seasons with Tennessee. He led the NFL with 4.5 sacks in the preseason and added 6 more in the regular season.

A technically sound player, **Mike Patterson** saw significant action during his rookie campaign and led all Eagles D-linemen with 66 tackles and led all NFL rookie defensive tackles with 3.5 sacks. "He's so explosive," said defensive coordinator Jim Johnson. "He's going to make plays because he's got great quickness and great pad level." Patterson was the Eagles first round draft choice in 2005 after winning back-to-back national championships at USC.

In 2006, Patterson set a team record with a 98-yard fumble return for a touchdown at San Francisco, breaking Joe Lavender's record of 96 yards set in 1974. He also had 1.5 sacks among his 82 tackles. Patterson inked a 7-year contract extension on 11/2/06 that will keep him in Philadelphia through 2016.

Darwin Walker has posted 26.5 sacks since becoming a full-time starter in 2002 and has been a key player in the middle of the defensive line. Walker, who earned his degree in civil engineering, is also a vice president and chief development officer of Pennoni Associates, Inc., a highly successful Philadelphia-based consulting engineering firm. Walker was claimed off waivers from the Cardinals in 2000.

Nicknamed "Truck Driver" by his teammates for his blue collar persona and work ethic, **Sam Rayburn** has been a solid performer over the past three years since signing as a rookie free agent in 2003.

Bunkley, the team's first round draft choice in 2006, was a disruptive force for Florida State in 2005, garnering numerous All-America honors with 9 sacks and 25 tackles for a loss.

Lajuan Ramsey, a sixth round draft pick of USC in 2006, rounds out the defensive tackle position.

Injured Reserve:

Nicknamed "The Freak" for his combination of speed, power, and intensity, **Jevon Kearse** was acquired by the Eagles on the first day of the free agent signing period in 2004 and went on to lead the team with 7.5 sacks in each of his two seasons in Philadelphia. He has 70 career sacks (including playoffs) and three Pro Bowl selections. His 2006 season came to an end in week 2 after suffering sprains of multiple ligaments in his left knee.

► LINEBACKERS

A powerful middle linebacker with four Pro Bowls on his resume, **Jeremiah Trotter** continues to be the pulse of the Eagles defense. Trotter is one of four linebackers in team history to earn four or more Pro Bowl selections, joining Chuck Bednarik (8), Maxie Baughan (5), and Bill Bergey (4). A 3rd round draft choice of Philadelphia in 1998, he has averaged over 145 tackles since becoming a full-time starter in 1999. Trotter played for Washington from 2002-03.

In 2006, Trotter led the team with 161 tackles.

Dhani Jones, who has patrolled the SAM linebacker spot since signing as an unrestricted free agent from the New York Giants in 2004, has averaged 109 tackles over the last five seasons, including 93 in 2006.

Omar Gaither, a 5th round draft pick from Tennessee, earned a roster spot with a productive preseason and a starting spot at WILL prior to the team's week 12 contest vs. Carolina. In his 2nd career start at Washington (12/10), Gaither posted his first career interception off of Jason Campbell. One week later, he recorded his first career sack (Eli Manning) at NYG.

Shawn Barber is back for his second stint in Philadelphia after inking a one-year contract in March. A play-making and cerebral linebacker, he spent the past three seasons in Kansas City after a successful one-year stop with the Eagles in 2002, when he posted 119 tackles and 2 INTs in Jim Johnson's defense.

The Eagles second round draft pick in 2005, **Matt McCoy** earned the starting WILL linebacker to start the season. McCoy was one of the most productive linebackers at San Diego State, finishing his three-year career with 396 tackles, 8 sacks, and 40 TFLs.

Dedrick Roper was originally acquired by Philadelphia off of Pittsburgh's practice squad in 2005.

Rookie free agent linebacker **Torrance Daniels** (Harding) was added from the Eagles practice squad on November 21. He became the first product from that Arkansas college to ever see action in a NFL game.

Injured Reserve:

Chris Gocong, one of college football's most prolific sack artists at Cal-Poly, was a third round draft pick in 2006. He finished his collegiate career with 42 sacks in 41 games at the Division I-AA level. He suffered a stinger early in training camp and was placed on IR prior to the season opener.

► DEFENSIVE BACKS

Six-time Pro Bowl selection **Brian Dawkins** is strong and tough enough to stop the run and fast enough to cover receivers. Dawkins landed a starting role in week 2 of his rookie season in 1996 and has not looked back. His interception total of 32 ranks 4th in team history behind leaders Eric Allen and Bill Bradley (34 each). He emulates his game after his favorite comic book hero, Wolverine of the X-Men, who is known for his animal-keen sense that allows him to track his adversaries with great ease. Dawkins earned a two-year contract extension this summer that will keep him in Philadelphia through 2008.

Dawkins has won 93 games in an Eagles uniform, more than any other player in team history. He had 155 tackles, 4 INTs, 5 forced fumbles, and 1 sack in 2006, en route to earning a starting role on the NFC Pro Bowl squad. He also earned NFC Defensive Player of the Week honors after a 16-tackle, 3 takeaway (2 forced fumbles and 1 INT) performance vs. the Giants on December 17.

Two-time Pro Bowl CB **Lito Sheppard** is a speedy and fearless defender who has shown a penchant for big plays during his first three years as a starter. He leads the Eagles with 14 INTs over that span,

including three returned for scores. Sheppard, the club's first round pick in 2002, is signed through 2011 and earned a Pro Bowl selection in 2004 and 2006.

POSITION-BY-POSITION ROUNDUP

In 2006, Sheppard returned from a three-game hiatus after suffering an ankle injury in the first quarter of the season opener at Houston, with a two-INT outing vs. Dallas (10/8), including a dramatic, 102-yard INT return for the game-clinching touchdown in the waning seconds. As a result, Sheppard became the first player in NFL history to post two 100-yard-plus interception returns for touchdowns in a career. Sheppard also clinched a game 12 win vs. Carolina by intercepting a Jake Delhomme pass in the end zone with 28 seconds to play in a 27-24 victory. Sheppard's six INTs for 157 return yards (2nd in NFL) helped him earn a berth on the NFC Pro Bowl squad.

One of the most consistent players on defense, **Sheldon Brown** is a proven, versatile cornerback. He led the team with 4 INTs in 2005 and was one of three NFL players to record a TD via a fumble and INT return. "I want to be smash mouth," says Brown, who consistently makes plays vs. the run and the pass. "I don't want to have a uniform without grass stains on it at the end of the day."

Brown intercepted Wash's Mark Brunell in week 10 and returned it 70 yards for a TD.

Sean Considine earned a starting role at strong safety early in the 2006 season. He has impressed Eagles coaches from day one of his first mini-camp, possessing good football knowledge as well as a knack for finding the ball. A 4th round pick in 2005, he landed in IR for the latter half of his rookie season with a shoulder injury.

Fellow safety **Michael Lewis** led the Eagles in tackles (402) from 2003-05 and is one of the league's most imposing defensive backs. Lewis earned a Pro Bowl berth in 2004. He was a 2nd round draft choice of Philadelphia in 2002. Lewis scored his first career touchdown in a game 13 win at Washington, intercepting a Jason Campbell pass and returning it 84 yards for a TD.

Roderick Hood has been a productive cornerback and special teamer since 2003, when he was signed as a rookie free agent. A former walk-on at Auburn, Hood posted career highs with 3 INTs while filling in for an injured Sheppard in 2005. Hood missed six games with a heel injury in 2006.

Quintin Mikell is also a quality reserve safety and proven special teams demon. He was a rookie free agent signing from Boise State in 2003. Mikell led the special teams units with 35 tackles in 2006 and added 26 more on special teams.

Cornerback **Joselio Hanson**, who played with San Francisco in 2004, provides depth at the defensive back spot.

On October 31, the Eagles added CB **William James** (formerly Will Peterson). James was a third round draft choice of the New York Giants in 2001 and played in 51 games (39 starts) for the Giants, recording 199 tackles, 35 passes defended and 5 interceptions. He was limited to just two games in 2005 due to a back injury and was released on May 26, 2006.

► SPECIAL TEAMS

A three-time Pro Bowl kicker, **David Akers** ranks first on the club's all-time list with 173 field goals and second in points (789). Known for producing in clutch situations, Akers has nailed 11 game-tying or game-winning field goals with 5:00 or less remaining in a game. Akers inked a contract extension last year that will keep him in Philadelphia through 2010.

Now in his fourth season in Philadelphia, **Dirk Johnson** has been a consistent punter for the Eagles. His 38.4 net average in 2005 was the highest by an Eagles punter since 1976. Johnson withstood four trips to the waiver wire before settling into Philadelphia in 2003. Johnson, in fact, earned a six-year contract extension on August 31st that will keep him in Philadelphia through 2011. Both Johnson (sports hernia) and Akers (hamstring) returned from injury-plagued seasons in 2005.

Long snapper **Jon Dorenbos** was signed on 11/29 after **Mike Bartrum** (neck) was placed on Injured Reserve. A four-year pro, Dorenbos saw action with Buffalo and Tennessee. **Koy Detmer** was re-signed by the Eagles on 1/2/07 to serve as the holder on special teams, replacing **Dirk Johnson**, who served in that capacity throughout the regular season.

Reno Mahe earned All-Pro honors from Pro Football Weekly in 2005 after leading the league with a 12.8 yard punt return average.

The coverage units are led by 2005 special teams MVP **Quintin Mikell**. He is joined by veterans **Sean Considine**, **Greg Lewis**, **Dedrick Roper**, **Joselio Hanson** and rookie **Omar Gaither**.

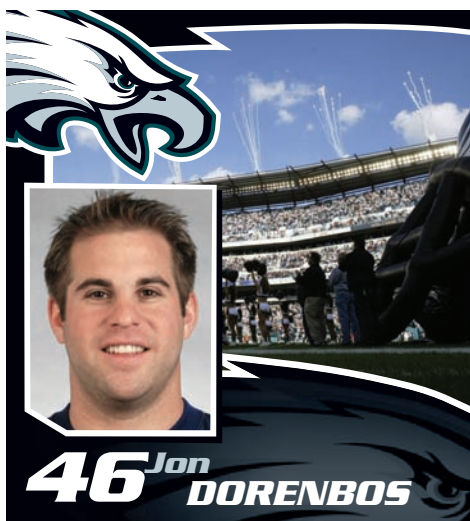

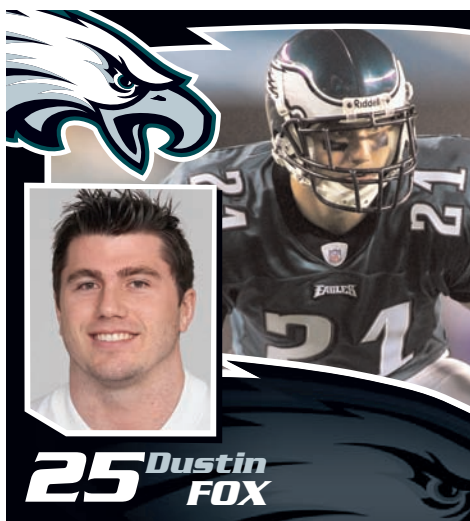
