The kids got a behind-the-scenes look at Arrowhead Stadium and visited the American Jazz Museum and the Negro Leagues Baseball Museum, in addition to being treated to activity-filled dinners with the Chiefs' rookie class, swimming and other fun sightseeing around the city.

Dallas Cowboys tight end **JASON WITTEN** hosted more than 1,000 youngsters at his annual free football camp in his hometown of Elizabethton, Tennessee. The cameras were rolling to capture the NFL star, along with teammates **TONY ROMO** and **TERENCE NEWMAN**, reviewing key football drills while emphasizing important life-skills such as teamwork, sportsmanship and hard work.

San Francisco 49ers quarterback **ALEX SMITH** launched the Guardian Scholars program with San Diego State University to provide 10 former foster youth with full five-year scholarships, including year-round housing, tutoring and mentoring services. Smith will add 10 new foster students to the program each year until his foundation supports 50 students at any given time. In June, Smith was filmed as he met his hand-selected scholars for the first time at a private bowling and pizza party on the SDSU campus.

This year's United Way commercials will not only feature these three programs, but will also highlight the Washington Redskins promoting youth fitness, the Oakland Raiders working with athletes from the Special Olympics, and the Bears building homes in Chicago, in addition to many other community outreach programs conducted by NFL players and teams around the league.
