MIAMI DOLPHINS @ BALTIMORE RAVENS

BALTIMORE HASN'T WILTED UNDER HIGH EXPECTATIONS THIS SEASON AND STOOD TALL AGAIN LAST WEEK. THE RAVENS SCORED ON THEIR FIRST DRIVE AND NEVER TRAILED THE DOLPHINS.

BALTIMORE FORCED THREE INTERCEPTIONS AND SHUT-OUT MIAMI IN THE SECOND HALF.

THE RAVENS CELEBRATION WILL BE SHORT LIVED, AS THEY HAVE JUST THREE DAYS BETWEEN GAMES THIS WEEK.

SAN DIEGO CHARGERS @ HOUSTON TEXANS

WITH ALL OF THEIR STARTING RECEIVERS SIDELINED BY INJURY, PHILIP RIVERS TURNED TO LITTLE-KNOWN <u>BACKUPS</u> TO DIG THE CHARGERS OUT OF AN EARLY HOLE.

RIVERS IS THE NFL'S LEADER IN PASSING YARDAGE AND TOUCHDOWNS, AND LAST SUNDAY HE TORE UP THE TEXANS.

RIVERS HELPED PUT SAN DIEGO UP BY SIX, BEFORE HIS DEFENSE MADE A FINAL STOP TO SECURE THE CHARGERS' FIRST ROAD WIN OF THE SEASON.

NEW YORK GIANTS @ SEATTLE SEAHAWKS

ELI MANNING HAD PLENTY OF CHANCES AGAINST THE SEAHAWKS, AND HE MADE THE MOST OF THEM. IN A FIRST HALF THAT SAW THE GIANTS SCORE 35 UNANSWERED POINTS, MANNING THREW FOR 3 TOUCHDOWNS, INCLUDING A 46 YARDER TO HAKEEM NICKS.

INDIANAPOLIS COLTS @ PHILADELPHIA EAGLES

ON THE EAGLES FIRST PLAY FROM SCRIMMAGE, LESHON MCCOY STAGGERED THE COLTS WITH A BODY BLOW UP THE GUT.

TWO PLAYS LATER, MIKE VICK LANDED A STIFF JAB.

TRAILING 13 TO NOTHING, THE COLTS SPRANG OFF THE CANVAS

INDIANAPOLIS SCORED 17 SECOND QUARTER POINTS AND LED AT THE HALF.

PHILLY'S PASSING ATTACK BEGAN TO FALTER.

BUT UNDER ANDY REID, THE EAGLES HAD NEVER LOST IN 11 GAMES COMING OFF THE BYE WEEK. VICK'S LEGS KEPT THAT STREAK RUNNING.

THIS SCRAMBLE AT THE END OF THE THIRD QUARTER LED TO A TOUCHDOWN IN THE FOURTH—AND A NINE POINT LEAD.

WITH EIGHTEEN SECONDS REMAINING, THE COLTS HAD THE BALL TRAILING BY TWO.

TAMPA BAY BUCCANEERS @ ATLANTA FALCONS

TO BEGIN THEIR SUNDAY DRIVE, THE FALCONS WENT TO THE PUMP.

THE OFFENSE MOTORED 61 AND 99 YARDS ON THEIR FIRST TWO POSSESSIONS. BOTH ENDED WITH MICHAEL TURNER TOUCHDOWNS.
