### **SAN DIEGO CHARGERS @ NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS**

THE FALCONS HAD ANOTHER PROBLEM -- PROTECTING THEIR QUARTERBACK.

MATT RYAN TOOK A BEATING, BUT WAS STILL ABLE TO STAKE ATLANTA TO AN EARLY LEAD.

VICK ABSORBED SOME SHOTS OF HIS OWN, AND THE FALCONS CONVERTED THOSE SHOTS INTO THREE EAGLES TURNOVERS.

ATLANTA TOOK AN ELEVEN-POINT 3<sup>RD</sup> QUARTER LEAD, BUT IT DIDN'T LAST LONG.

A PAIR OF LESEAN MCCOY SCORES PUT THE EAGLES AHEAD 31-21 IN THE 4<sup>TH</sup> QUARTER. BUT WHEN VICK WAS KNOCKED OUT OF THE GAME BY COLLIDING WITH A TEAMMATE, IT OPENED THE DOOR TO A FURIOUS FALCON COMEBACK.

RYAN TOSSED HIS 4<sup>TH</sup> TOUCHDOWN PASS OF THE NIGHT, AND THEN TURNED TO MICHAEL TURNER.

## **CHICAGO BEARS @ NEW ORLEANS SAINTS**

FORMER TULANE GREEN-WAVE RUNNING BACK MATT FORTE WAS THE ONLY BEAR TO MAKE A SPLASH IN NEW ORLEANS. HE GAINED 166 TOTAL YARDS AND HELPED CHICAGO TO AN EARLY LEAD.

BUT NEW ORLEANS COUNTERED WITH A TIDAL WAVE OF POINTS.

IN THE FIRST HALF THE SAINTS DEFENSE DIDN'T REGISTER A SACK. IN THE SECOND HALF, THEY RACKED UP SIX, WHILE HOLDING CHICAGO TO JUST 81 YARDS OF OFFENSE.

## **DALLAS COWBOYS @ SAN FRANCISCO 49ERS**

THE 49ERS TOOK A 2 TOUCHDOWN LEAD...THEN TEED OFF ON TONY ROMO.

ROMO SUFFERED A FRACTURED RIB AND A PUNCTURED LUNG...BUT STAYED IN THE GAME AND BROUGHT DALLAS TO WITHIN 7.

BACK UP JON KITNA REPLACED ROMO IN THE 3<sup>RD</sup> QUARTER...AND DALLAS TIED THE GAME AT 14.

BUT AFTER THE 49ERS TOOK A 24 TO 14 LEAD...THE COWBOYS MADE A SWITCH.

### **SOUNDBITE - "STAY READY JON, I'M NOT KIDDING"**

TONY ROMO HAS HIS CRITICS...BUT THEY CAN'T QUESTION HIS TOUGHNESS, ESPECIALLY WHEN HE RE-ENTERED THE GAME.

DALLAS TIED THE GAME AT 24 AT THE END OF REGULATION, AND IN OVERTIME, A FORMER PRACTICE SQUAD WIDE RECEIVER MADE THE MOST ASTONISHING PLAY.

## **CINCINNATI BENGALS @ DENVER BRONCOS**

THE BRONCOS AND FIRST-YEAR COACH JOHN FOX RECEIVED A BOOST IN WEEK-1 FROM INEXPERIENCED WIDE RECEIVER ERIC DECKER.

DECKER'S FIRST "ACCOMPLISHMENT" IN WEEK-2 WAS SETTING UP THE BENGALS FOR THREE POINTS.

"DECK" TOOK "B-DAWK'S" WORDS TO HEART.

DECKER CAUGHT FIVE PASSES FOR 113-YARDS AND TWO TOUCHDOWNS.

IN FOUR FOURTH QUARTER PLAYS CINCINNATI PULLED TO WITHIN TWO POINTS.

WITH LESS THAN A MINUTE REMAINING, THE BRONCOS HELD ON BY THEIR FINGERNAILS.

### **JACKSONVILLE JAGUARS @ NEW YORK JETS**

IN WEEK TWO REX RYAN WENT AGAINST HIS OWN PHILOSOPHY, AND TOOK THE BALL WHEN THE JETS WON THE TOSS, LOOKING TO CHALLENGE HIS OFFENSE AFTER 16 STRAIGHT GAMES WITHOUT A FIRST QUARTER TOUCHDOWN.

RYAN CAN ALSO TAKE CREDIT FOR THE JETS DEFENSE, WHO PUT FORTH A RECORD SETTING PERFORMANCE IN WEEK 2.

NEW YORK'S DEFENSE TOOK OVER THE GAME, FORCING FOUR INTERCEPTIONS AND HOLDING JOSH MCCOWN TO A **1.8** QUARTERBACK RATING.

### **OAKLAND RAIDERS @ BUFFALO BILLS**

JIM KELLY ONCE PERFECTED BUFFALO'S K-GUN OFFENSE. SUNDAY, RYAN FITZPATRICK, THE AMISH RIFLE, MISFIRED ON THE WAY TO A 21 TO THREE HALFTIME DEFECIT.
