THE SAINTS QUARTERBACK BAFFLED THE BUCS WITH BOTH HIS ARM AND HIS FEET.

BREES AND A TRIO OF NEW ORLEANS BACKS GASHED TAMPA BAY FOR NEARLY 200 RUSHING YARDS.
