PITTSBURGH STEELERS @ CINCINNATI BENGALS

OVER THE PAST DECADE, CINCINNATI HAS BEEN THE STEELERS HOME AWAY FROM HOME.

ENTERING SUNDAY, PITTSBURGH HAD WON NINE OF ITS PAST 10 AT PAUL BROWN STADIUM. /
THE STEELERS RACED TO A 14 TO NOTHING LEAD.

(RADIO - STEELERS TD, BENCH)

THE BENGALS WERE LOOKING TO PROVE THEIR 6 AND 2 START WAS NO FLUKE.

(RADIO – A.J. GREEN TD)

CINCINNATI EVENTUALLY TIED THE GAME AT 17. / BUT PITTSBURGH REGAINED THE LEAD IN THE THIRD QUARTER.

(RADIO - TD; TIMMONS INT.; "A TURNOVER, THIS IS GREAT!")

THE STEELERS DEFENSE HAS STRUGGLED TO PRODUCE TURNOVERS ALL SEASON. / BUT A WEEK AFTER HE WAS BEATEN FOR THE DECIDING TOUCHDOWN IN A LAST-SECOND LOSS,

CORNERBACK WILLIAM GAY SEALED THE WIN.

GAY'S ACT OF REDEMPTION PUT THE STEELERS BACK INTO SOLE POSSESSION OF FIRST PLACE IN THE AFC NORTH.

OAKLAND RAIDERS @ SAN DIEGO CHARGERS

NORV TURNER MIGHT HAVE BEEN SMILING AT THE PROSPECT OF AN EASY WIN OVER THE RAIDERS AND THEIR STRUGGLING NEW QUARTERBACK, CARSON PALMER.

PALMER BEGAN THIS GAME WITH A BANG, AS HE PASSED FOR 169 YARDS IN THE FIRST HALF.

'POWER" MEANT MICHAEL BUSH, WHO FINISHED THE GAME WITH 157 RUSHING YARDS.

THESE BITTER RIVALS CONTINUED A BLOOD FEUD THAT DATES BACK TO THE DAWN OF THE OLD AFL. IN THIS VERSION OF THE GRUDGE MATCH,

PHILIP RIVERS HAD A ROUGH EVENING.

ALTHOUGH RIVERS TOOK A POUNDING IN THE PASS POCKET, HE AND PALMER WAGED A 3RD QUARTER DUEL.

THE RAIDERS HELD A 14 POINT LEAD, BUT THE CHARGERS NEVER RELENTED.

WITH LESS THAN 4 MINUTES REMAINING, SAN DIEGO WAS IN OAKLAND TERRITORY -- CLOSING IN ON A GAME-TYING TOUCHDOWN.

NEW YORK GIANTS @ SAN FRANCISCO 49ERS
