Week 11

CINCINNATI BENGALS @ BALTIMORE RAVENS

(OVER OPENING SHOT; SHOULD CLEAR BALL SNAP)

SOME HAVE CRITICIZED THE RAVENS FOR NOT FLEXING ENOUGH MUSCLE WITH THEIR GROUND GAME LATELY.

***(AFTER BALL SNAP, SHOULD END BEFORE NICE
MUSIC PHRASE IN RICE SHOT)***

BUT LAST SUNDAY, AN OFFENSE THAT HAD BECOME PASS-HAPPY RE-COMMITTED TO A MORE BALANCED ATTACK.

***(END OF RICE SHOT AND START OF FLACCO;
LOTS OF ROOM TO LET MUSIC PLAY)***

RAY RICE RUSHED FOR 104 YARDS AND TWO TOUCHDOWNS, AND JOE FLACCO ADDED TWO SCORING PASSES.

(RADIO – BOLDIN TD)

THE BENGALS WERE LOOKING FOR ANY WAY TO CORRAL BALTIMORE'S PLAYMAKERS.

***(RADIO – "THAT'S WHAT HAPPENS WHEN
YOU WEAR THE BIG DREADLOCKS")***

IT WAS ABOUT THE ONLY TO SLOW RAVENS ROOKIE TORREY SMITH, WHO FINISHED WITH A
HAIR RAISING SIX CATCHES FOR 165 YARDS.

(RADIO – SMITH TD; CAMERON – “WE KNOW HOW TO WIN EM”)

THE RAVENS USUALLY DO FIND A WAY TO WIN, AND GET THE RIGHT BOUNCES.

(RADIO – SMITH INT., “RON WINTER IS AT THE BOTTOM OF THE PILE”)

(AFTER RADIO, SHOULD BACKTIME INTO DALTON SNAP AND MUSIC CHANGE)

TWO SECOND HALF INTERCEPTIONS THAT LED TO SCORES APPEARED TO BURY THE BENGALS.
BUT DOWN 31 TO 14 AT THE START OF THE FOURTH QUARTER, ANDY DALTON RALLIED
CINCINNATI.

(RADIO – CALDWELL TD; REED – “WE GOT TO CALM DOWN MAN”)

(AFTER REED, OVER MARVIN LEWIS WATCHING)

TRAILING 31 TO 21, THE BENGALS HAD A CHANCE TO PULL WITHIN THREE.

(RADIO – GRESHAM TD, “THIS WILL BE REVIEWED.”)

AFTER THE REVIEW, THE SCORE WAS OVERTURNED.

**(RADIO – THAT’S THE CALVIN JOHNSON RULE;
BENGAL “WE GOTTA GET IT, LET’S GO”)**

(RIGHT AFTER NEW MUSIC START, OVER DALTON ROLLOUT)

AFTER A FIELD GOAL, CINCINNATI STILL TRAILED BY SEVEN. BUT IN THE FINAL MINUTES, THE BENGALS PUT THEMSELVES IN POSITION FOR THE TYING TOUCHDOWN.

(RADIO – DALTON HAS ICE WATER IN HIS VEINS)

HOWEVER, THE BENGALS WERE ON THIN ICE AFTER THE ROOKIE QUARTERBACK WAS CALLED FOR INTENTIONAL GROUNDING.

(RADIO – LAST PLAY, END OF GAME)

PHILADELPHIA EAGLES @ NEW YORK GIANTS

JUST SAY PHILLY TO A GIANT AND THE REACTION IS POSITIVELY PAVLOVIAN.

COURSE, THE EAGLES ARE SALIVATING TOO.

RADIO: ARE THEY SAYING HE STEPPED OUT OF BOUNDS?

THEY DID, BUT A SINGLE SNAP LATER IT WAS A MOOT POINT.

THE GIANTS TIED THE GAME AT THE START OF THE 4TH QUARTER.

VINCE YOUNG MADE HIS FIRST START IN A YEAR MEMORABLE.// TOO BIG TO KNOCK DOWN, AND PATIENT ENOUGH TO FIND THE OPEN MAN, YOUNG DROVE THE EAGLES 80 YARDS, CONVERTING 6 THIRD DOWNS ALONG THE WAY.

SAN DIEGO CHARGERS @ CHICAGO BEARS

(Opening three shots beginning with guys pointing right after music begins...)

FROM AFAR, A TEAM'S STRUGGLES CAN SEEM EASILY CORRECTABLE. / LATELY THE CHARGERS HAVE HAD A HARD TIME FINDING THEIR WAY. BUT FROM THE MOMENT HE ARRIVED AT SOLDIER FIELD FOR HIS MATCH-UP WITH CHARLES TILLMAN AND THE BEARS, WIDE RECEIVER VINCENT JACKSON TOOK EVERY PROPER ROUTE.

(End of ground replay of Jackson catch and into top shot of his TD catch...)

JACKSON CAUGHT SEVEN PASSES FOR 175-YARDS AND A TOUCHDOWN.

(After Tillman dejection, top shot of Cutler to Knox right after music begins...)

WITH THE SCORE TIED IN THE SECOND QUARTER, JAY CUTLER AND THE BEARS SCORED TOUCHDOWNS ON FOUR CONSECUTIVE POSSESSIONS.

(Coming off "Keep it going" Bears bench sound, Knox line of scrimmage ground shot...)

IN THE THIRD QUARTER, JOHNNY KNOX AND CUTLER CONNECTED AGAIN TO GIVE CHICAGO A 31-17 LEAD.

(Coming off "Good job men" bench sound, shot of "Go Bears" sign...)

(Note: please have the break in the line be placed such that the ramp-up crash of music on the shot change to Cutler's hands under center can be heard. Let me know if this doesn't make sense.)

WITH THE BEARS LEADING 31-20 IN THE FOURTH QUARTER... / ...JAY CUTLER THREW AN INTERCEPTION THAT WILL HAVE LASTING CONSEQUENCES FOR CHICAGO.

(Coming off INT radio during ground shot of Cason return...)

CUTLER'S SUCCESS IN CORRALLING ANTOINE CASON CAME WITH A PRICE. THE BEARS QUARTERBACK BROKE HIS RIGHT THUMB.

(Matt Forte comes into the frame to finish the tackle...)

THREE PLAYS LATER IT BECAME CLEAR THAT CUTLER HAD HELPED TO PRESERVE A BEARS VICTORY. // BUT IN SO DOING, HE HAS ALTERED THE COURSE OF THEIR SEASON.

TENNESSEE TITANS @ ATLANTA FALCONS

ARIZONA CARDINALS @ SAN FRANCISCO 49ERS

EVEN WHEN A DOWNPOUR TURNED CANDLESTICK PARK INTO A POND, NINERS COACH JIM HARBAUGH WAS SINGIN' IN THE RAIN.

THE 49ERS DEFENSE STORMED EVERY QUARTERBACK THE CARDINALS THREW AT THEM, AND BY THE TIME THE SUN CAME OUT, ALEX SMITH WAS ABLE TO PROVIDE A RAINBOW OF HIS OWN.

OAKLAND RAIDERS @ MINNESOTA VIKINGS

BEFORE AN ANKLE SPRAIN TOOK MINNESOTA'S BEST PLAYER OUT OF THE GAME, ADRIAN PETERSON DID WHAT HE DOES BEST.

WITHOUT THEIR STAR RUNNING BACK, THE VIKINGS' OFFENSE FLOUNDERED WHILE OAKLAND'S MICHAEL BUSH FLOURISHED, CARRYING THE BALL 30 TIMES AND RUSHING FOR OVER 100 YARDS FOR THE 2ND WEEK IN A ROW.
