MINNESOTA VIKINGS @ GREEN BAY PACKERS

WEBB GOT OFF TO A HOT START RUNNING THE READ-OPTION.

HOWEVER, IN THE POCKET, THE QUARTERBACK WHO HADN'T ATTEMPTED A PASS ALL SEASON WAS INEFFECTIVE/ AND HIS THROWS WERE, AT TIMES, INEXPLICABLE.

(RADIO - NEAR INT.; "THAT WAS TOTAL FOOTBALL INSANITY)

WEBB COMPLETED JUST 11 OF 30 PASSES.

(RADIO - SHIELDS INT.: GREENE SOUND, PETERSON SOUND)

AFTER GIVING UP MORE THAN 400 YARDS RUSHING TO ADRIAN PETERSON IN TWO REGULAR SEASON GAMES, THE PACKERS HELD THE MVP CANDIDATE TO A MORE MANAGEABLE 99. / A BIG DIFFERENCE WAS THE RETURN OF DEFENSIVE BACK CHARLES WOODSON, WHO HAD MISSED THE TWO PREVIOUS GAMES AGAINST PETERSON.

(SOUND - WOODSON BRINGS A WHOLE NEW DIMENSION)

BY CONTAINING PETERSON, GREEN BAY MADE THE NIGHT EVEN TOUGHER ON WEBB.

(RADIO – MATTHEWS FORCES FUMBLE)

CHAD GREENWAY DID HIS BEST TO DENY THE PACKERS YARDS, AND EVEN SERVICE.

(GREENWAY - "NO SOUP FOR YOU.")

NO <u>SOUP</u> FOR THE PACKERS, JUST MEAT AND POTATOES FOOTBALL. / BALL CONTROL DRIVES ENDING IN TWO FIRST HALF SCORING RUNS.

(ALT.) NO APPETIZER FOR THE PACKERS, JUST A MAIN COURSE OF MEAT AND POTATOES FOOTBALL. / BALL CONTROL DRIVES ENDING IN TWO FIRST HALF SCORING RUNS.

(RADIO – KUHN TD RUN; VIKINGS SIDELINE; "IT AIN'T GONNA BE EASY.")

THE MOST DIFFICULT CHALLENGE FOR THE VIKINGS WAS CONTAINING AARON RODGERS. SEEKING HIS FIRST PLAYOFF VICTORY AT LAMBEAU FIELD, RODGERS PLAYED WITH HIS USUAL ACCURACY AND ELUSIVENESS.

(VIKINGS SIDELINE, GREENWAY SOUND CHASING RODGERS)

RODGERS KEPT THE VIKINGS GUESSING ALL NIGHT. / HE SET AN NFL PLAYOFF RECORD BY COMPLETING PASSES TO 10 DIFFERENT RECEIVERS.

(GREENWAY TO KUHN "HE AIN'T GONNA THROW IT TO YOU.")

RODGERS <u>DID</u> THROW TO NO. 30 FULLBACK JOHN KUHN, FOR THE SCORE THAT PUT THE GAME OUT OF REACH.

(RADIO – KUHN TD CATCH, END OF GAME)

CINCINNATI BENGALS @ HOUSTON TEXANS

IN THE FIRST HALF, HOUSTON HELD THE BENGALS TO ONLY THREE PASSING YARDS.

EARLY IN THE SECOND QUARTER, CINCINNATI TRAILED SIX-NOTHING.

ARIAN FOSTER CARRIED THE TEXANS DOWN THE FIELD, AND INTO THE RED ZONE.
