PHILADELPHIA EAGLES @ GREEN BAY PACKERS

FROM THE OPENING WHISTLE RANDALL COBB AND THE PACKERS EXPLODED, AND THIS BATTLE BETWEEN PLAYOFF CONTENDERS TURNED INTO A LAUGHER.

FOR THE SECOND STRAIGHT WEEK, GREEN BAY SCORED OVER 50 POINTS AT HOME; SETTING A NEW FRANCHISE RECORD.

THE BUCCANEERS DEFENSE SACKED RG3 SIX TIMES AND FORCED THREE TURNOVERS.

SEATTLE SEAHAWKS @ KANSAS CITY CHIEFS

SEAHAWKS FANS WERE SILLY. BUT JAMAAL CHARLES MADE THEIR DEFENSE LOOK RIDICULOUS WITH 159 YARDS AND TWO TOUCHDOWNS.

THE SEAHAWKS ACCOUNTED FOR 20 POINTS IN THE 2ND AND 3RD QUARTERS TO TAKE THE LEAD.

DENVER BRONCOS @ ST LOUIS RAMS

ATLANTA FALCONS @ CAROLINA PANTHERS

AFTER THREE QUARTERS, CAM NEWTON HAD UNDER 100 PASSING YARDS. AND CAROLINA TRAILED 16-3.

BUT IN THE FOURTH QUARTER, NEWTON PASSED FOR 193 YARDS AND COMPLETED ALL SEVEN OF HIS THROWS TO KELVIN BENJAMIN.

PITTSBURGH STEELERS @ TENNESSEE TITANS

ON TENNESSEE'S FIRST OFFENSIVE PLAY, THE STEELERS SAID, "TANK YOU."

TENNESSEE RECOVERED, AND HELD AN 11 POINT LEAD EARLY IN THE FOURTH.

BUT THE TITANS COULD NOT STOP LE'VEON BELL—OR THE CLOCK. BELL RAN FOR 204 YARDS AS THE STEELERS HELD THE BALL FOR OVER 39 MINUTES.
