RUSSEL WILSON DID NOT COMPLETE A PASS UNTIL THERE WAS 5:36 REMAINING IN THE HALF. HIS SECOND COMPLETION SET UP SEATTLE'S FIRST SCORE.

SUPER BOWL XVIX- 2ND QUARTER

WITH JUST OVER TWO MINUTES IN THE HALF, BRADY DROVE NEW ENGLAND DEEP INTO SEATTLE TERRITORY.

31 SECONDS WERE ALL THAT REMAINED UNTIL HALFTIME—AND RUSSELL WILSON MADE THE MOST OF EVERY TICK OF THE CLOCK.

HIS 23-YARD COMPLETION TO RICARDO LOCKETTE—PLUS A PENALTY—GAVE THE SEAHAWKS THE BALL AT THE PATRIOTS ELEVEN WITH SIX SECONDS IN THE HALF.

SUPER BOWL XVIX- 3rd QUARTER

"21" WAS AN UNDRAFTED ROOKIE CORNERBACK NAMED MALCOLM BUTLER. IN THE SECOND HALF, BUTLER REPLACED KYLE ARRINGTON THE PATRIOTS NICKEL DEFENSE.

NEW ENGLAND BEGAN TO PUT THE CLAMPS ON RUSSELL WILSON. / THE SEAHAWKS FIRST TWO DRIVES OF THE FOURTH QUARTER WENT THREE AND OUT.
