AFC PLAYOFF PICTURE A GROUP PHOTO

As the weather turns colder, NFL fans can warm themselves in front of a red-hot playoff race as the season turns toward the home stretch. In the AFC alone, 11 teams are within one game or .500 or better with five weeks left on the schedule.

Among the clubs seeking to strengthen their position in a competitive field are the AFC East-leading New England Patriots (8-3, .727). Winners of six of their past eight games, the Patriots seek their fourth consecutive division title and their fifth in the past six years under head coach **BILL BELICHICK**.

"When you come into the last third of the season roughly, which is Thanksgiving, your games at the end of November and December, those are critical games for every team," says the New England coach. "These are the games that are really going to decide who is standing at the end. There's a lot at stake. They're all big."
