THEY'RE HERE! PLAYOFFS KICK OFF WITH WILD CARD WEEKEND

Sports' ultimate reality show is ready for its grand finale.

The NFL playoffs are here with its hard reality: win and you go on, lose and you go home.

"Playoffs, playoffs, playoffs!" says New York Jets running back LEON WASHINGTON. "It feels good to say it."

It feels good – no, great – for all 12 clubs in the 2006 playoffs. They earned it through 17 hard weeks of competition, <u>surviving with honors</u>:

- The cumulative winning percentage for all 12 clubs is .672 (129-63). Eight of the 12 teams won at least 10 games.
- Many of the clubs enter the playoffs on a roll. San Diego has won 10 in a row the third team since 2000 to begin the playoffs with that lengthy a streak (2003, New England, 12; 2004, Pittsburgh, 14). Baltimore has won nine of its last 10, New England six of its last seven, the New York Jets five of their last six, and Philadelphia five in a row.
- It is a "fresh face" playoffs, with seven clubs Baltimore, Dallas, Kansas City, New Orleans, New York Jets, Philadelphia and San Diego – making the final 12 after missing out last year. It is the 10th consecutive year that at least five clubs accomplished such a feat.
- It's a <u>solid</u> playoffs, led by teams that have been consistently good over the years, with winning percentages of .600 or more over the past five seasons Indianapolis (.750), New England (.738), Philadelphia (.663) and Seattle (.600).
- It's a <u>resilient</u> playoffs. Three of the teams Baltimore, New Orleans and Philadelphia -- went from "worst to first" in their divisions, winning their divisions after finishing last in 2005. It is the first time in history that three teams achieved such a turnaround, and fifth time since 2000 that two teams did it.

So, 25 years after "The Catch" (Montana to Clark) in the 1981 NFC Championship Game (1/10/82) and 20 years after "The Drive" by John Elway in the 1986 AFC Championship Game (1/11/87), who knows what the NFL playoffs have in store:

NFL PLAYOFF FACTOID

YOUNG 'UN: The New York Jets' **ERIC MANGINI** (35) this Sunday can become the third-youngest head coach to win a playoff game, after **JOHN MADDEN** (33, Oakland, 1969) and **RAY FLAHERTY** (34, Washington, 1937).

KANSAS CITY CHIEFS (9-7) at INDIANAPOLIS COLTS (12-4) (Saturday, NBC, 4:30 PM ET)

STORYLINE: KC's LJ vs. Indy's DL.

That's **LARRY JOHNSON**, who set a league record for carries this season (416; and finished No. 2 in NFL rushing with 1,789 yards) against an Indianapolis defense that finished 32nd in the league against the rush. "We've got to get ready for him," says Colts head coach **TONY DUNGY**, who confronts his old assistant head coach in Tampa Bay – Chiefs coach **HERMAN EDWARDS**. "He's a great back. We'll have our hands full."

Of course, that will go both ways. The Chiefs' 18th ranked pass defense will go up against the league's No. 2 passing offense directed by the NFL's leading passer this year, **PEYTON MANNING** (101.0), and abetted by Indy's two 1,000-yard receivers, **MARVIN HARRISON** and **REGGIE WAYNE**. The duo has 21 TD catches between them, most for any team's top two receivers in 2006.

DALLAS COWBOYS (9-7) at SEATTLE SEAHAWKS (9-7) (Saturday, NBC, 8:00 PM ET)

STORYLINE: Matt vs. DeMarcus.

Of course, that's not the only key matchup of the game – you've got Dallas **RBs JULIUS JONES** (1,084 yards) and **MARION BARBER** (14 rush TDs, third most in the league) against 2007 Pro Bowl LBs **JULIAN PETERSON** and **LOFA TATUPU** -- but it may be pivotal.

The Seahawks and **QB MATT HASSELBECK** have operated behind an OL in injury flux this year, and have surrendered the most sacks of the 12 playoff teams – 49. The Cowboys come off a loss to Detroit in which they used a four-man front that helped produce five sacks. Three came from starting Pro Bowl **LB DE MARCUS WARE**, who tied San Diego's **SHAUN PHILLIPS** (11.5) for the second-most LB sacks this season.

"The NFC East is a very physical division," says Seahawks head coach **MIKE HOLMGREN**. "When you play Dallas, you know you've got to deal with their defense. They are capable of not giving up any points."

Of course, Dallas can't over-commit, or **RB SHAUN ALEXANDER** – with an NFL-best string of 64 games with a run of 10 yards or more – can burn them.

NEW YORK JETS (10-6) at NEW ENGLAND PATRIOTS (12-4) (Sunday, CBS, 1:00 PM ET)

STORYLINE: You guys again, Part I.

The first of two Sunday East Division playoff matchups (see Giants-Eagles below). And it's the rubber game in each, with each winning at the other's place. A total of 10 points separated the Jets and Patriots this year, with New England winning 24-17 in September in New Jersey, and New York 17-14 in November in Foxboro.

This one's got a lot of storylines aside from the Jets' **ERIC MANGINI**-Pats' **BILL BELICHICK** head-coaching connection. Like, what does Jets defensive coordinator **BOB SUTTON** concoct to negate **QB TOM BRADY**, who is 10-1 in the playoffs and has thrown only five pickoffs in those 11 games – for a 1.36 interception percentage, lowest in playoff history.

Or can the Patriots handle the constantly shifting and adjusting offense – including the no-huddle -- of Jets coordinator **BRIAN SCHOTTENHEIMER**? All that motion is helped by **WRs JERRICHO COTCHERY** and **LAVERNAUES COLES**, who tied for second in the league in third-down receptions (29) with six TDs between them.

NEW YORK GIANTS (8-8) at PHILADELPHIA EAGLES (10-6) (Sunday, FOX, 4:30 PM ET)

STORYLINE: You guys again, Part II.

First, there was that 17-point Giants comeback win in overtime in Philly in September. Then **JEFF GARCIA**'s 19-yard TD pass to give the Eagles a 36-22 win in December. Now comes the '06 tiebreaker.

The Eagles are hot, and the Giants seem to have heated up at just the right time. Philly, under QB Garcia (who replaced an injured **DONOVAN MC NABB** on November 19), is on a five-game win streak. A lot of the credit for that goes to **RB BRIAN WESTBROOK**, who has averaged 102 yards per game since November, not including last Sunday when his load was lightened once the Eagles had won the division.

New York's Week 17 win over Washington was sparked by a vintage **TIKI BARBER** rushing production, this one a teamrecord-setting 234-yard, three-TD night. Barber finished fourth in the league with 1,662 yards, but the Eagles, led by **LB JEREMIAH TROTTER**, limited him to 126 yards in this season's two meetings.

<u>NEW YORK</u>...<u>NEW YORK</u>!: This is the fifth time in the history of the Jets and Giants that the teams have appeared in the same playoffs (1981, 1985, 1986 and 2002).

HEAD COACHES HERM EDWARDS of KC & **TONY DUNGY** of Ind both served Chiefs from 1990-91. Edwards was KC scout, Dungy was team's DB coach. Both are former NFL DBs & each played in Super Bowl (Dungy, Pit, SB XIII; Edwards, Phil, SB XV).

<u>CHIEFS</u>: Head coach Edwards guides team to playoffs in 1st year at helm. Edwards is 5th HC in NFL history to lead 2 teams to playoffs in 1st season w/ those clubs; most recent to achieve feat was **WADE PHILLIPS** (Den 1993; Buf 1998)... In 3 career meetings vs. Colts, including 1 playoff, **QB TRENT GREEN** has 7 TDs vs. 3 INTs. In 51 career road starts,

Green has completed 59.6 pct. of passes. Green (21,459) is franchise's 2nd-leading all-time passer, trailing only **HOFer LEN DAWSON** (28,507). Dawson is team's color radio analyst...**RB LARRY JOHNSON** has 21 100-yd games in past 2 yrs. Johnson (1,789) set club rushing record for 2nd consecutive season. His rush yds & rush TDs (17) both 2nd in NFL behind San Diego's **LA DAINIAN TOMLINSON**. Johnson set NFL record in 2006 w/ 416 rush attempts. In 3 career starts in domes, Johnson has 419 rush yds on 79 carries (5.3 avg.) w/ 3 TDs. Team is 3-0 in those games. Johnson finished 3rd among AFC RBs w/ 410 receiving yds...**WR EDDIE KENNISON** (5) & **TE TONY GONZALEZ** (5) tied for club lead in TD catches. Kennison has TD catch in 3 of past 5 games & has posted 5 catches in each of 2 career meetings vs. Ind. Gonzalez caught 8 passes for 125 yds & 2 TDs in last game vs. Ind (10/31/04)...Rookie **DE TAMBA HALI** led club w/ 8.0 sacks in '06 for 3rd most by rookie in club history. Hali finished season w/ sack in 3 games in row. **CB TY LAW** (w/NE) posted 3 INTs vs. Colts in 2003 AFC Championship. Including playoffs, Law has 7 INTs in past 11 games vs. Colts...**P DUSTIN COLQUITT** finished the season with a 39.3 net punting average, tops in NFL & 2nd highest in Chiefs history. Colquitt is son of former NFL **P CRAIG COLQUITT**, who punted for Colts in 1987, was part of 2 SB champion Steelers teams (SB XIII, XIV), & was Steeelrs teammate of Colts HC Dungy.

COLTS: Head coach Dungy has led his teams to playoffs in 8 consecutive seasons. In 25 yrs as NFL head coach or assistant, Dungy's defenses have scored 71 TDs. Dungy aims to join HOFer MIKE DITKA & TOM FLORES as 3rd person to win Super Bowl as player & head coach... In 5 career games vs. KC, including playoffs, QB PEYTON MANNING is 4-1 (.800) & has passed for 12 TDs vs. 3 INTs for 110.1 passer rating. Manning has 15 TDs vs. 8 INTs in 9 career playoff games. Manning completed '06 w/ NFL-best 101.0 passer rating, leading league in category for 3rd consecutive season & marks 1st time since HOFer STEVE YOUNG (four, 1991-94) that QB has posted 100+ passer rating in 3 yrs in row...Rookie RB JOSEPH ADDAI leads team & all rookie rushers w/ 1,081 yds, averaging 4.8 yds per carry w/7 rush TDs. Addai has at least 1 rush of 10+ yds in 11 of past 13 games...WR MARVIN HARRISON has 80+ catches in 8 seasons in row. Harrison (122) stands 8th in career total TDs. Manning & Harrison have combined for 106 TD receptions – most in NFL history by any tandem. Including playoffs, Harrison has 6 TDs in 6 career games vs. KC w/ at least 5 catches in each. WRs Harrison (1,366) & WR REGGIE WAYNE (1,310) compose 7th teammate tandem in NFL history to post 1,300 rec. yds each in same season. Team No. 1 in AFC total offense (379.4) & is No. 1 in NFL w/ 56.1 in 3rd down conversion pct. (105 of 187)...DE DWIGHT FREENEY has 56.5 sacks in 79 career games. LB CATO JUNE (162) led club on season in tackles. CBs JASON DAVID & NICK HARPER tied for team lead w/ 11 PDs in '06...K ADAM VINATIERI has made 26 playoff FGs, tied for 2nd most in NFL postseason history (GARY ANDERSON, 32). Vinatieri has made FG in 12 consecutive playoff games & needs 1 more to tie NFL record (TONI FRITSCH, 13).
