**BROWNS HEAD COACH ROMEO CRENNEL, TITANS HEAD COACH JEFF FISHER
& COWBOYS HEAD COACH BILL PARCELLS
CANDIDATES FOR MOTOROLA NFL COACH OF THE WEEK AWARD**

Fans to Vote for Winner on NFL.com

Head coaches **ROMEO CRENNEL** of the Cleveland Browns, **JEFF FISHER** of the Tennessee Titans and **BILL PARCELLS** of the Dallas Cowboys are the nominees for Motorola NFL Coach of the Week honors for games played November 30 and December 3-4, the NFL announced today.

Fans can vote on NFL.com for the head coach whose game plan played the greatest role in his team's victory. Voting will take place from Tuesday morning through noon EST on Thursday to determine the Motorola NFL Coach of the Week. The winner will be announced Thursday afternoon on NFL.com. In January, voting will be held on NFL.com to determine the Motorola NFL Coach of the Year.

A closer look at the Motorola NFL Coach of the Week nominees:

- **ROMEO CRENNEL's** Cleveland Browns hosted the 7-4 Kansas City Chiefs on Sunday, and overcame a 28-14 fourth-quarter deficit to defeat the Chiefs in overtime 31-28 on a 33-yard field goal by Phil Dawson. The Browns' comeback was all the more impressive due to the fact that it was led by backup quarterback Derek Anderson, who had taken only one NFL snap prior to the game. Anderson took over for the injured Charlie Frye and completed 12 of 21 passes for 171 yards and two touchdowns. He also ran for 44 yards, including a 33-yard scamper to set up the game-winning field goal in OT.
- Tennessee's **JEFF FISHER** led the Titans to their third consecutive win as Rob Bironas' 60-yard, last-minute field goal gave Tennessee a 20-17 victory over the AFC South-rival Indianapolis Colts. Down 14-0 in the second quarter, Fisher's team rallied with rookie quarterback Vince Young once again leading the way. Young threw for 163 yards and two touchdowns and ran for 78 yards in the win. The Titans defense intercepted Colts quarterback Peyton Manning twice to help Tennessee avenge a 14-13 loss to Indianapolis earlier in the season.
- Dallas' **BILL PARCELLS** led the Cowboys to a last-second 23-20 road victory over the NFC East-rival New York Giants on Sunday. By defeating his former team, Parcells has the Cowboys poised to win the division, as they now enjoy a two-game lead over the Giants with four games to play. Quarterback Tony Romo threw for 257 yards and led the Cowboys into field goal range for Martin Gramatica's 46-yard field goal with one second remaining. Running back Marion Barber ran for 76 yards and two touchdowns as Dallas improved to 8-4.
