JAGUARS HEAD COACH JACK DEL RIO, EAGLES HEAD COACH ANDY REID & CHARGERS HEAD COACH MARTY SCHOTTENHEIMER CANDIDATES FOR MOTOROLA NFL COACH OF THE WEEK AWARD

Fans to Vote for Winner on NFL.com

Head coaches **JACK DEL RIO** of the Jacksonville Jaguars, **ANDY REID** of the Philadelphia Eagles and **MARTY SCHOTTENHEIMER** of the San Diego Chargers are the nominees for Motorola NFL Coach of the Week honors for games played October 8-9, the NFL announced today.

Fans can vote on NFL.com for the head coach whose game plan played the greatest role in his team's victory. Voting will take place from Tuesday morning through noon EST on Friday to determine the Motorola NFL Coach of the Week. The winner will be announced Friday afternoon on NFL.com. In January, voting will be held on NFL.com to determine the Motorola NFL Coach of the Year.

A closer look at the Motorola NFL Coach of the Week nominees:

- Jacksonville's JACK DEL RIO led the Jaguars to a 41-0 victory over the New York Jets on Sunday.
 Following consecutive losses that left Jacksonville at 2-2, the Jaguars responded with inspired
 performances on both the offensive and defensive sides of the ball. Running backs Fred Taylor and
 Maurice Jones-Drew combined for 170 yards and three touchdowns, quarterback Byron Leftwich threw
 two touchdown passes and the defense recorded six sacks, three interceptions and one fumble
 recovery.
- Philadelphia's ANDY REID coached his Eagles to a 38-24 victory over the Dallas Cowboys on Sunday.
 Reid kept his team focused during the week leading up to Philadelphia's showdown with their NFC East
 division rival. The Eagles' offense accumulated 383 yards, with quarterback Donovan McNabb
 throwing touchdown passes of 40 and 87 yards and running for another score. The defense recorded
 seven sacks, three fumble recoveries and three interceptions, the last of which cornerback Lito
 Sheppard returned 102 yards for the game-sealing touchdown.
- San Diego's MARTY SCHOTTENHEIMER led his team to a 23-13 come-from-behind victory over the
 Pittsburgh Steelers on Sunday night. The Chargers bounced back from their first loss of the season
 last week and overcame an early 10-0 deficit against the defending Super Bowl champions.
 Schottenheimer opened up the passing attack against the Steelers, as Chargers quarterback Philip
 Rivers threw 37 passes, completing 24 of them for 242 yards and two touchdowns. San Diego's
 intimidating defense went to work in the second half, holding Pittsburgh scoreless.
